## A) SCOPE of Services

In general, the Scope of Services includes, but is not limited to, the following:

<p>Legends Global, on behalf of the Colorado Convention Center (CCC), is soliciting proposals from qualified contractors for the procurement and installation of a commercial-grade LED lighting system along Stout St. The lighting system will enhance facility operational capabilities and event flexibility by providing adjustable colors and patterns across extended linear distances.</p> <p><b>Project Overview</b> The CCC requires a commercial-level LED lighting solution capable of supporting long linear runs while operating on standard 110V power. The selected contractor will be responsible for furnishing all equipment, labor, materials, and installation services in accordance with project specifications and Denver Prevailing Wage requirements.</p> <p><b>Scope of Work</b> The contractor shall provide a complete lighting system and perform installation as detailed below.</p> <p><b>Lighting System Requirements</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Lighting must be commercial-level quality, suitable for heavy public-use exterior environments.</li> <li>○ System must utilize LED technology with long-life, high-efficiency fixtures.</li> <li>○ Lighting must support adjustable colors and programmable patterns, suitable for various event themes and facility needs.</li> <li>○ System must be capable of a continuous run of approximately 1,300 feet, including all required power distribution, controllers, and connectors. Controller interface to be approved by the CCC.</li> <li>○ System shall operate on 110V power.</li> </ul> <p><b>Installation Requirements</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Contractor shall install all lighting, cabling, controllers, and supporting hardware per manufacturer recommendations and applicable codes.</li> <li>○ All installation work will be event schedule dependent, with access restricted to times approved by CCC Event Management.</li> <li>○ Contractor shall coordinate all work windows in advance and ensure no disruption to ongoing facility operations or booked events.</li> <li>○ Contractor shall provide all required lifts, ladders, and scaffolding. 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**B) Permits, Licenses, and Laws**

- Vendor shall be required to provide and maintain any permits and licenses required by law at its own expense.

**C) Experience/Expertise**

- Knowledge of service and certification as per manufacturer requirements
- Knowledge of LED Lighting, software, products, uses and troubleshooting
- Industry knowledge in LED lighting that is programmable as to color and pattern
- Trained Technicians should be able to provide certifications, display industry knowledge, and thorough training.
- Familiar with LEED certification requirements and ability to supply products that help CCC meet that need.

**D) Required information**

- Vendor's Certification
- Itemized quote to include scope of services, description, unit price, applicable sales tax, and any additional charges or fees that may apply.
- All price quotations must be firm and state when they expire.
- Technical and Warranty Specifications if applicable.
- Your terms of payment.
- Three (3) Current Service References
- If the Respondent is an MBE or WBE certified by the City and County of Denver and/or State of Colorado, the Response should indicate so.
- Prevailing Wage Requirements

Any contract in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) or more shall be subject to the following provisions concerning the payment prevailing wages, if any work is performed onsite.

- The minimum wages to be paid for every class of labor, mechanics and worker shall be not less than the scale of wages from time to time determined to be the prevailing wages.
- VENDOR or his subcontractor shall pay mechanics, laborers and workers employed directly upon the site of the work the full amounts accrued at time of payment, computed at wage rates not less than those stated or referenced in the specifications, and any addenda thereto, on the actual date of bid opening, or in effect on the date of grant of permit for performance of such work under D.R.M.C. Section 49-171 et seq., or on the date of the written Purchase Order for contracts let by informal procedure under D.R.M.C. Section 20-63(b), regardless of any contractual relationship which may be alleged to exist between VENDOR or subcontractor and such laborers, mechanics and workers.
- VENDOR and subcontractors to pay all workers, mechanics and other laborers at least once a week the full amounts of wages accrued at the time of payment except that VENDOR and subcontractor shall make such payments to non-construction workers such as janitorial or custodial workers at least twice per month.
- VENDOR shall post in a prominent and easily accessible place at the site of the work the scale of wages to be paid by VENDOR and all subcontractors working under VENDOR.
- If VENDOR or any subcontractor shall fail to pay such wages as are required by the contract, the Auditor shall not approve any warrant or demand for payment to VENDOR until the contractor

furnishes the Auditor evidence satisfactory to the Auditor that such wages so required by the contract have been paid.

- F. VENDOR shall furnish to the Auditor each week during which work is in progress under the contract, a true and correct copy of the payroll records of all workers, laborers and mechanics employed under the contract, either by VENDOR or subcontractors.
- G. The copy of the payroll record shall be accompanied by a sworn statement of VENDOR that the copy is a true and correct copy of the payroll records of all mechanics, laborers or other workers working under the contract either for VENDOR or subcontractors, that payments were made to the workers, laborers and mechanics as set forth in the payroll records, that no deductions were made other than those set forth in such records, and that all workers, mechanics and other laborers employed on work under the contract, either by VENDOR or by any subcontractor, have been paid the prevailing wages as set forth in the contract specifications.
- H. If any laborer, worker or mechanic employed by VENDOR or any subcontractor under the contract has been or is being paid a rate of wages less than the rate of wages required by the contract to be paid as aforesaid, Legends Global and the City and County of Denver may, by written notice to

VENDOR, suspend or terminate the contractor's right to proceed with the work, or such part of the work as to which there has been a failure to pay the required wages, and in the event of termination may prosecute the work to completion by contract or otherwise, and the contractor and any sureties shall be liable to Legends Global for any excess costs occasioned Legends Global thereby.
