2. Bidders assume full responsibility and cost for the timely delivery of bids, in the manner required, and to the specified location, on or before the date and time specified.
3. Sealed Bids received after time and date specified will be returned unopened, if appropriate.

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4. All bids must be signed by an authorized company representative. Failure to do so shall result in automatic rejection. See attached **Signature Page**.
5. Pricing to be submitted on the attached bid form.
6. If bidding any item other than the exact item specified, use the space provided to specify substitute (also see #7 below for preapproved brands). Include manufacturer's product literature adequately describing any items proposed for substitution. A substituted item is an item that is equal or a suitable substitute for our needs for this project.

8. Bidders should complete a Nutrient Standard Form for each product on the bid.
9. Unit prices are requested on all items and prices will be firm for the duration of this contract.
10. Identify earliest delivery or installation dates possible unless noted otherwise.
11. The quantities listed are estimates; we reserve the right to adjust these quantities as needed. The quantities may be reduced (affected) or increased based upon the receipt of USDA donated foods. When the order is placed, the exact quantity to be delivered will be indicated by the person placing the order.

Substitution of contract items is not permitted without prior approval from Child Nutrition; items will be returned to vendor.

12. APSB reserves the right to:
 - Reject any bid if deemed unacceptable;
 - Award all or any portion of the requested items;
 - Adjust actual quantities of items as required;
 - Award items on an individual line-by-line basis, unless stated otherwise.
13. All items to be bid FOB destination, freight included.
14. Bidders are responsible for all costs associated with shipment, delivery, delivery delays, temporary storage and any other costs associated with fulfillment of solicitation.

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- 15. Include Sealed Bid number on any correspondence.
- 16. Any bid exceeding fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) and includes installation of any item on any APSB property requires bidder to be **appropriately** licensed by the Louisiana State Licensing Board for Contractors (in accordance with R.S. 37:2150-2163). Contractor's License number is to be clearly indicated on the outside of the bid envelope.
 - Bidders are required to hold proper license even if state-licensed subcontractor is proposed to be retained by bidder for installation work.

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18. Termination for Cause & Termination for Convenience

APSB may terminate the contract for cause based upon the failure of the contractor to comply with the terms and/or conditions of the contract, or failure to fulfill its performance obligations pursuant to the contract, provided that the APSB shall give the contractor written notice specifying the contractor's failure. If within thirty (30) days after receipt of such notice, the contractor shall not have corrected such failure or, in the case of failure which cannot be corrected in thirty (30) days, begun in good faith to correct such failure and thereafter proceeded diligently to complete such correction, then APSB may, at its option, place the contractor in default and the contract shall terminate on the date specified in such notice.

The contractor may exercise any rights available to it under Louisiana law to terminate for cause upon the failure of APSB to comply with the terms and conditions of the contract, provided that the contractor shall give APSB written notice specifying the APSB failure and a reasonable opportunity for APSB to cure the defect.

APSB may terminate this contract at any time by giving thirty (30) days written notice to contractor of such termination or negotiating with the contractor an effective date.

The contractor shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress, to the extent work has been performed satisfactorily.

19. Required Review and Waiver of Objections by Respondents

Bidders should carefully review these documents and all attachments for defects, objections, or any other matter requiring clarification or correction. Comments concerning document objections must be made in writing no later than 5 days prior to the bid deadline. This will allow issuance of any necessary amendments.

Protests based on any objection shall be considered waived and invalid if these faults have not been brought to the attention of the APSB Supply Chain Department prior to the deadline above.

*Submittal of a bid shall constitute acceptance of the terms, conditions, criteria, requirements, and resulting contract, and it operates as a waiver of any objection.

20. Response Withdrawal

Bidders may withdraw a submitted bid at any time up to the deadline for submittal. To withdraw a bid, the bidder must submit a written request, signed by an authorized representative, to the point of contact before the deadline for submitting bids. After withdrawing a previously submitted bid, the bidder, may submit another bid at any time up to the deadline for submitting the bid.

21. Response - Amendments and Errors

The APSB shall not accept any amendments, revisions, or alterations to bids after the deadline for submittal.

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Bidders are liable for all errors or omissions contained in their response. Bidders shall not be allowed to alter response documents after the deadline for submittal.

22. Property of Response

All materials submitted in response to this procurement process become the property of the APSB. Selection or rejection of a response does not affect this right. All submittal information shall be held in confidence during the evaluation process and prior to the time a Notice of Intent to Award is issued. Upon the completion of the review and evaluation of all documents submitted in response to the solicitation, all documents shall become public documents of the APSB and open for review by the public. By submitting a response, the bidder acknowledges and accepts that the full contents of the response shall become a public record open to public inspection.

23. Addenda

Prior to the deadline for response, the APSB reserves the right to issue addenda. Bidders are responsible for ensuring receipt of all addenda and incorporating any changes into their response. Bidders shall acknowledge receipt of all addenda. The owner reserves the right to reject a response for failure to acknowledge receipt of any addenda. Addenda will be posted at www.beaconbid.com/solicitations/ascension-parish-schools.

24. Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2216.1 (Act 581)

This public contract is subject to *Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2216.1* and/or *Louisiana Revised Statute 39:1602.2* [whichever statute is applicable to this contract] enacted by *Act 581 of the 2024 Louisiana Legislature*. By submitting a bid or proposal or accepting a contract with the APSB, the company/bidder affirmatively acknowledges that this contract is governed by *Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2216.1* and/or *Louisiana Revised Statute 39:1602.2* [whichever statute is applicable to this contract] and that the terms of said statutes are incorporated into the bid or contract by the company. Further, subject to *Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2216.1* and/or *Louisiana Revised Statute 39:1602.2* [whichever statute is applicable to this contract], the company/bidder expressly verifies, agrees, and affirms each the following:

- (1) The company/bidder does not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association based solely on the entity's or association's status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association.
- (2) The company/bidder will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association during the term of the contract based solely on the entity's or association's status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association.

- If awarded, requires contractor/vendor to provide current insurance certificate complying with APSB requirements. See **APSB Contractor/Vendor Insurance Requirements**.

- Is subject to, and requires compliance with, Federal Contract Clauses. See attached **APSB Federal Contract Clauses**.

- Requires pricing to also be submitted as an editable digital file. (i.e. Excel (.xlsx))
- Will be awarded as a group; therefore, this is an 'all or nothing' bid.
- Is a one-time purchase with pricing effective immediately.
- A bid security in an amount of not less than five percent (5%) of the base bid and all additive alternates is required for this bid. The bid security shall be in the form of a certified check or cashier's check drawn on a bank insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or a bid bond (A.I.A. Document A310) written by a surety company licensed to do business in Louisiana, countersigned by a person who is under contract with the surety company or bond issuer as a licensed agent in Louisiana who is residing in Louisiana and accompanied by appropriate power of attorney and in favor of the Owner. The surety company shall be licensed to do business in the State of Louisiana listed in the Department of the Treasury Circular 570, latest revision. The Surety Company shall have an A.M. Best Company minimum rating with a minimum financial size in accordance with the General Conditions.

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SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

Special Conditions in addition to Standard Conditions:

General Requirements:

- All items containing flour must be made with enriched flour.
- All canned fruits and vegetables shall be of the most recent crop.
- When drained weights are specified, they shall be considered as minimum. When minimum drained weights are not specified, the cans shall be of standard fill.
- Canned foods shall conform in every respect to provisions of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act and amendments thereto and to subsequent decision of the USDA, also, to the laws of the State of Louisiana. Canned foods shall be prepared, canned, and sealed under sanitary conditions and in accordance with good commercial practice.
- All food products must be produced in a nut free facility.
- LRS 39:2101, enacted by Act 79, of the Louisiana Legislature, 1997 Regular Session, mandates that all state agencies, state institutions, and local school districts which operate food service facilities for students, patients or inmates utilize only those meat, poultry and seafood products that have met all Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) requirements for grading and certification service. The statute further requires that such food contracts contain a provision to this effect. The ordering agency, with authorization form and under the supervision of LDAF, may conduct a self-certification inspection of products received.
- Vehicles that meet Food Safety Standards shall deliver all foods. Refrigerated vehicles shall deliver all perishable foods. Ascension Parish reserves the right to inspect any delivery vehicle for standard compliance.
- The vendor should include a signed product formulation statement and/or CN label dated no earlier than 2024. The vendor should also provide MSDS documentation for each item awarded on bid.
- **For Chemicals Bid Only:** Deliveries must be made at least monthly. During delivery, vendor must conduct preventative maintenance, regular maintenance, and check installed equipment for accurate dilution. If there's an issue with installed equipment, vendor must be on-site for repair in less than 24 hours after repair call. Empty containers must be picked up and removed as a part of monthly delivery.

Delivery Requirements:

- Deliveries to the cafeterias must be made between the hours of 7:00 am and 1:00 pm.
- The unit price for each item must include all transportation charges prepaid to the destination. All items shall be delivered to the delivery point of the individual schools on the date or dates specified when the order is placed. Deliveries are not to be left outside of the facility for any reason. Milk and Bread are to be delivered each school day, Dry Goods delivered once a month, Frozen Foods & Meats delivered weekly, and Processing Supplies as scheduled. Deliveries made by third party package delivery companies such as USPS, FedEx, UPS, and other similar carriers will not be accepted.

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SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS (CONT)

- The vendor must immediately notify the Child Nutrition office of the inability to deliver for any reason. The Child Nutrition Program reserves the right to cancel/reject items which the vendor has failed to deliver at the time specified.
- **For Milk & Milk Related Products Bid Only:** Deliveries of milk and milk-related products are to be made prior to 8:00 am each school day. If scheduled deliveries are NOT made and this results in fluid milk being unavailable, the vendor must pay the amount of federal reimbursement Ascension Public Schools Child Nutrition Program is ineligible to claim due to the above USDA policy.
- **Inability to Deliver or Change of Brand Delivered** – If for any reason deliveries cannot be made on schedule, and/or if there is a change in the brand that is to be delivered, the Child Nutrition Program must be notified in sufficient time to determine if the brand that will be delivered meets requirements, or to make further arrangements concerning the items that cannot be delivered. If the vendor is in error in making a delivery, it is the vendor's responsibility to correct the delivery error made.

Invoicing/Payment Requirements:

- Food and non-food items must be invoiced separately.
- It is mandatory that an invoice, in duplicate, must accompany each delivery. All invoices must be signed and dated by a CHILD NUTRITION EMPLOYEE at the time of delivery to assure payment. This signature is the only acceptable proof of delivery. Back orders not permitted.
- All statements and credit memos should be emailed to Child Nutrition Accounting Secretary, Sherry Fletcher at sherry.fletcher@apsb.org no later than the third business day after the close of the previous month.
- Payment will be made on the basis of the unit price as listed in the contract. Such price and payment will constitute full compensation of furnishing and delivering the contract commodities. Payment will be made within thirty (30) days after receipt of statement, invoice, delivery, authorized inspection and acceptance, whichever occurs last. Payment for items will only be made to the company that was awarded. No payments will be made to secondary vendors that may be used by the awarded company for bid completion, such as when a secondary vendor is used for delivery purposes, etc. No payment for interest charges, service charges, or shipping will be paid.

School Security:

- Successful vendors awarded, must provide a statement on company letterhead to the Ascension Public Schools Child Nutrition Program, showing that their employees who make deliveries to APSB schools, have had a background/security check completed before deliveries are made to schools. Any person with a criminal offense cannot make deliveries to a school campus. The successful vendor hereby certifies that they will comply at all times during the term of this awarded contract to comply with this provision and never send delivery personnel to schools that have a criminal record. A default by the bidder of this compliance shall be automatic grounds of termination.

1. Nondiscrimination & Equal Opportunity (41 CFR Part 60-1.4(b))

The applicant hereby agrees that it will incorporate or cause to be incorporated into any contract for work, or modification thereof, as defined in the regulations of the Secretary of Labor at 41 CFR Chapter 60, which is paid for in whole or in part with funds obtained from the Federal Government or borrowed on the credit of the Federal Government pursuant to a grant, contract, loan, insurance, or guarantee, or undertaken pursuant to any Federal program involving such grant, contract, loan, insurance, or guarantee, the following equal opportunity clause:

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

(1) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following:

Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

(2) The contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.

(3) The contractor will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the contractor's legal duty to furnish information.

(4) The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the contractor's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

(5) The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.

(6) The contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.

(7) In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions

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may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.

(8) The contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance:

Provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted work: Provided, that if the applicant so participating is a State or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any agency, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

In addition, the applicant agrees that if it fails or refuses to comply with these undertakings, the administering agency may take any or all of the following actions: Cancel, terminate, or suspend in whole or in part this grant (contract, loan, insurance, guarantee); refrain from extending any further assistance to the applicant under the program with respect to which the failure or refund occurred until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant; and refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

2. Small and Minority Businesses, Women's Business Enterprises, and Labor Surplus Area Firms

APSB encourages participation from small, minority-owned, women-owned, and labor surplus area business. Incorporation of these types of firms into the project team is encouraged.

§200.321 Contracting with small and minority businesses, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms.

- (a) The non-Federal entity must take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that minority businesses, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms are used when possible.
- (b) Affirmative steps must include:
 - (1) Placing qualified small and minority businesses and women's business enterprises on solicitation lists;

4. Civil Rights Compliance

5. Anti-Kickback Clause

The Contractor hereby agrees to adhere to the mandate dictated by the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act which provides that each Contractor or subgrantee shall be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the completion of work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he is otherwise entitled.

6. Clean Air Act

The Contractor hereby agrees to adhere to the provisions which require compliance with all applicable standards, orders or requirements issued under Section 306 of the Clean Air Act which prohibits the use under non-exempt Federal contracts, grants or loans of facilities included on the EPA list of Violating Facilities.

7. Energy Policy and Conservation Act

The Contractor hereby recognizes the mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (P.L. 94-163).

8. Clean Water Act & Federal Water Pollution Control Act

The Contractor hereby agrees to adhere to the provisions which require compliance with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under Section 508 of the Clean Water Act which prohibits the use under non-exempt Federal contracts, grants or loans of facilities included on the EPA List of Violating Facilities.

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Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issues pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C 1251 et seq.

9. Record Retention, Record Ownership, & Access to Records

The Contractor shall maintain all records in relation to this contract for a period of at least five (5) years after final payment. All records, reports, documents, or other material related to any contract resulting from this solicitation and/or obtained or prepared by Contractor in connection with the performance of the services contracted for herein shall become the property of the APSB and shall, upon request, be returned by Contractor to APSB, at Contractor's expense, at termination or expiration of this contract.

Contractor agrees to allow the Federal government, GOSHEP or APSB access to a contractor's records.

10. Suspension and Debarment

This contract is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180 and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000. As such the contractor is required to verify that none of the contractor, its principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995), or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).
