State Charter School Facilities Incentive Grant Technical Assistance Scope of Work

Purpose, Background, and Goals

In 2025, the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) was awarded \$10 million through the Expanding Opportunity through Quality Charter Schools Program – State Charter School Facilities Incentive Grant (SFIG). This five-year federal grant supports states in establishing and enhancing per-pupil facilities aid programs for charter schools, in accordance with federal statute and program guidance. Indiana’s SFIG investment is a critical mechanism for creating a sustainable, enrollment-based facilities funding model, advancing the work of the Office of Educational Options and Quality (OEOQ) to strengthen high-quality school options within a parent-driven education system. Through this initiative, IDOE seeks to advance three key priorities:

- **Increasing Access:** SFIG will help schools secure and improve permanent instructional spaces while supporting school growth and expansion into high-need and historically underserved communities.
- **Increasing Quality:** SFIG will support safe, code-compliant, and instructionally aligned facilities while reducing reliance on costly short-term leases and unstable facilities arrangements.
- **Increasing Engagement:** SFIG will support the development of stable, welcoming school environments that build trust with families and strengthen community engagement.

The overarching goal of the initiative is to improve charter school facilities in ways that support enhanced learning environments and stronger student outcomes. The program’s objectives are to:

- Increase the number of high-quality charter school facilities statewide.
- Support charter school grantees in creating and sustaining high-quality academic environments.
- Prepare and support charter schools to serve students in high-needed areas and historically underserved populations, helping to close persistent achievement gaps.

To support these objectives, Indiana’s SFIG initiative sets aside funding for technical assistance, evaluation, and dissemination activities so charter schools have the guidance and tools needed to plan, finance, and sustain high-quality facilities that support stronger student outcomes. These supports are designed to strengthen schools’ capacity to plan, manage, and sustain facilities projects while meeting federal SFIG requirements.

Technical assistance activities will support schools in areas such as facilities planning, financing strategies, project implementation, and compliance with program requirements.

Evaluation of the SFIG initiative will be conducted by an independent third-party contractor to ensure objective assessment of program implementation and

outcomes.

A separate contractor will provide technical assistance (TA) to participating schools.

When appropriate, the technical assistance contractor and the evaluation contractor may coordinate to support program monitoring, data collection, and continuous improvement while maintaining independent evaluation practices.

Measuring Program Success

Success of the SFIG initiative will be measured through a combination of implementation indicators, facilities outcomes, and school-level results, aligned with federal Charter Schools Program guidance and Indiana's program priorities.

Expected outcomes include:

- Improved facilities quality and compliance, including facilities that meet local safety and building code requirements and support the school's instructional program
- Increased financial sustainability of school facilities, including reduced reliance on short-term leases and improved long-term facilities planning
- Expanded access to high-quality charter school facilities in high-need communities
- Improved school capacity to plan, finance, and manage facilities projects
- Positive stakeholder feedback from school leaders, educators, families, and community partners regarding school facilities and learning environments

Program evaluation will also examine potential relationships between facilities improvements and student outcomes, including school stability, student access, and academic performance trends. Findings from the evaluation will inform continuous program improvement, statewide dissemination of best practices, and reporting to the U.S. Department of Education through the Annual Performance Report (APR).

Contractor Responsibilities and Deliverables

Technical Assistance Delivery Model

Technical assistance activities will be delivered through a three-tiered support model to ensure that all SFIG subgrantees receive foundational support while schools with more complex facilities receive additional assistance.

For purposes of this program, subgrantees are charter schools receiving SFIG facilities funding through the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE). IDOE anticipates supporting approximately 10–20 subgrantees across Indiana over the course of the grant period, including schools located in both urban and rural communities.

IDOE will determine tier placement based on program monitoring, project complexity, and school needs. The contractor will deliver technical assistance aligned with the assigned tier.

Tier 1 – Universal Support

Audience: All SFIG subgrantees (approximately 10–20 schools)

Purpose: Provide foundational knowledge, shared resources, and guidance related to charter school facilities planning and SFIG program requirements.

Technical Assistance Activities

8 Training and Office Hours (Combined Session)

The contractor will facilitate one (1) combined training and office hours virtual session monthly consisting of:

- The contractor will lead a 60-minute virtual session for SFIG awardees that combines targeted training and interactive office hours. Each session will include a focused overview of a key facilities topic, followed by opportunities for participants to ask questions, discuss real-time challenges, and receive individualized guidance related to facilities planning and implementation.

Sessions may also include opportunities for schools to share effective practices or highlight successful facilities strategies. Topics may include, but are not limited to:

1. Facilities Planning & Project Management

Support schools with planning, renovating, and managing facilities projects, ensuring they meet safety, code, and instructional needs.

2. Aligning Facilities with Instructional Goals

Help schools design or modify spaces to better support learning environments, student needs, and academic programming.

3. Facilities Budgeting & Financing Guidance

Provide budget support, financing strategies, and long-term sustainability planning aligned with SFIG priorities.

4. Policies, Compliance & SFIG Requirements

Interpret relevant facilities policies and ensure schools can meet SFIG rules, reporting expectations, and documentation requirements.

5. Charter School Facilities Best Practices

Share proven strategies, models, and examples from high-performing charter operators to improve facility quality statewide.

The contractor will develop scalable resources for SFIG schools and the broader Indiana charter school community, including:

Tier 2 – Targeted Support

Audience: Subset of schools implementing significant facilities projects or requiring additional planning support (approximately 6–12 schools).

Purpose: Provide additional structured training and technical assistance for schools with more complex facility needs.

Technical Assistance Activities

Targeted Training

The contractor will facilitate four intensive training sessions for Tier 2 schools over the two-year grant period, with two sessions held each year. Each session will be two hours in length and will focus on key areas of facilities support to ensure strong planning, implementation, and compliance. Topics may include, but are not limited to:

1. Facilities Planning & Project Management Tools: These support renovation planning, timelines, and long-range decision-making.

Tier 3 – Intensive Support

Audience: Small number of schools requiring focused assistance (approximately 2 schools).

Purpose: Provide individualized support for schools experiencing significant facilities challenges or implementation barriers.

Technical Assistance Activities

Intensive Coaching

The contractor will provide up to 8 hours of individualized coaching over two years (4 hours per year) for each participating school. Coaching will be delivered to leadership teams responsible for facilities planning, finance, and operations. Support may include virtual coaching calls, scheduled in 30-minute increments, to provide targeted, school-specific assistance

Support may include:

- Root-cause analysis of facilities challenges
- Development of facilities action plans
- Project planning and implementation guidance
- Support preparing for facilities financing or capital planning

Deliverables

In-Person Workshop (Cross-Tier Learning)

The contractor will facilitate one half-day (4 hours) in-person workshop during the second year of the contract, hosted at the Indiana Department of Education.

The workshop will support peer learning across all tiers and focus on:

- Site selection and acquisition
- Renovation planning

- Facilities project management and best practices
- Budgeting and financing strategies
- Compliance with SFIG program requirements

The contractor shall provide services for a maximum of 28 hours over the two-year grant period, which equates to approximately 14 hours per year

Contract Value and Term

- The total contract value shall not exceed \$30,000 over a two-year period. IDOE anticipates this engagement to be delivered by a vendor providing targeted technical assistance and subject-matter expertise related to charter school facilities planning and compliance under the State Facilities Incentive Grant (SFIG) program.

Communication and Coordination

The contractor shall maintain a structured communication cadence with IDOE to ensure alignment with program goals, timelines, and federal reporting expectations.

At minimum, communication will include:

- Monthly check-in meetings with IDOE SFIG staff conducted virtually via Microsoft Teams
- Email communication as needed to provide updates on progress, risks, or emerging needs
- Coordination regarding upcoming trainings, technical assistance activities, and deliverables
- The contractor shall:
 - Provide timely updates on progress, risks, and emerging needs
 - Adjust timelines as needed in coordination with IDOE
 - Submit all deliverables in IDOE-specified formats
 - Ensure all deliverables are subject to IDOE review and approval
