The Board requests that a Non-Collusion Affidavit and a Service Provider Questionnaire & Certification be submitted with the proposal. The Proposal Package will also include other documents as listed on the checklist provided, that must be completed and returned with the proposal. Failure to complete and submit all **required** forms as listed on the checklist will be cause for disqualification and rejection of the proposal.

Recommendation of Purchases

Solicitation/Receipt of Gifts – Prohibited

School District officials and employees are prohibited from soliciting and receiving funds, gifts, materials, goods, services, favors, and any other items of value from Respondents doing business with the Board of Education or anyone proposing to do business with the Board.

SERVICE PROVIDER RESPONSIBILITY

Offer of Gifts, Gratuities -- Prohibited

Any Service Provider doing business or proposing to do business with the Board of Education shall neither pay, offer to pay, either directly or indirectly, any fee, commission, or compensation, nor offer any gift, gratuity, or other things of value of any kind to any official or employee of the Board of Education or any member of the official's or employee's immediate family.

Service Provider Influence -- Prohibited

No Service Provider proposing to do business with the Board of Education shall influence or attempt to influence any official or employee of the Board of Education in any manner that might tend to impair said official or employee's objectivity or independence of judgment.

SERVICE PROVIDER CERTIFICATION

Respondents will be asked to certify on the enclosed form titled "Service Provider/Service Provider Questionnaire & Certification" that no official or employee of the Board of Education or immediate family members are directly or indirectly interested in this request or have any interest in any portions of profits thereof. The Service Provider participating in this request must be an independent Service Provider, not an official or employee of the Board of Education.

1. PROMPTNESS OF PROPOSAL SUBMITTAL

This will occur promptly for this proposal on **Tuesday, June 30, 2026 @ 10:00 a.m.** No extensions or exceptions will be made. The Administrative Office is opened Monday through Friday from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm according to the public school calendar. Access to the Administrative Office may be delayed because of security clearance. Respondents **may also submit proposals** to the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary or his designee at the proposal opening meeting held in the Board Room of the Lakewood *Board of Education Administrative Offices located at 200 Ramsey Ave, Lakewood, NJ* on the advertised proposal opening date and time. Once again, proposals will not be received after the time designated in the advertisement.

2. PARKING

Parking in the vicinity of the Board of Education Administration Building is at a premium. ***Allow enough time to locate a parking space.***

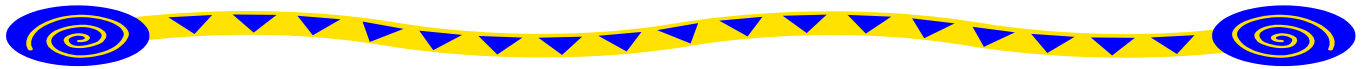

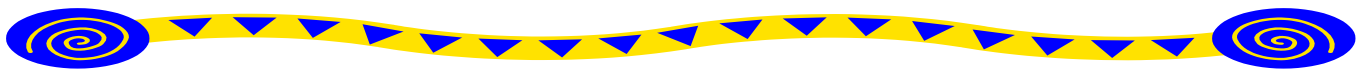

PURPOSE

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION REQUIREMENTS

If not submitted with the proposal packet, each company shall submit to the LAKEWOOD Board of Education, after notification of award, but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, **one** of the following three documents:

1. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The Service Provider must comply with all provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), P.L 101-336, in accordance with 42 U.S.C. S121 01 et seq.

2. AMERICAN GOODS (N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-20)

The District intends to purchase, wherever available, and practical, goods and materials manufactured in the United States

3. ANTI-BULLYING BILL OF RIGHTS—REPORTING OF HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION AND BULLYING—CONTRACTED SERVICE

The contracted Service Provider shall comply with all applicable provisions of the New Jersey Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act—N.J.S.A. 18A:37-13.1 et seq., all applicable code and regulations, and the Anti-Bullying Policy of the Board of Education. The District shall provide to the contracted Service Provider a copy of the board's Anti-Bullying Policy after the award of the contract

In accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.7 (c), a contracted Service Provider, who has witnessed, or has reliable information that a student has been subject to harassment, intimidation, or bullying shall immediately report the incident to any school administrator or safe schools resource officer, or the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary.

4. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION PROVISIONS—N.J.S.A. 10:2-1

N.J.S.A. 10:2-1. Antidiscrimination provisions. Every contract for or on behalf of the State or any county or municipality or other political subdivision of the State, or any Service Provider of or authority created by any of the foregoing, for the construction, alteration or repair of any public building or public work or for the acquisition of materials, equipment, supplies or services shall contain provisions by which the Service Provider agrees that:

a. In the hiring of persons for the performance of work under this contract or any subcontract hereunder, or for the procurement, manufacture, assembling or furnishing of any such materials, equipment, supplies or services to be acquired under this contract, no Service Provider, nor any person acting on behalf of such Service Provider or sub-Service Provider, shall, by reason of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, gender identity or expression, affectional or sexual orientation or sex, discriminate against any person who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates;

b. No Service Provider, sub-Service Provider, nor any person on his behalf shall, in any manner, discriminate against or intimidate any employee engaged in the performance of work under this contract or any subcontract hereunder, or engaged in the procurement, manufacture, assembling or furnishing of any such materials, equipment, supplies or services to be acquired under such contract, on account of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, gender identity or expression, affectional or sexual orientation or sex;

c. There may be deducted from the amount payable to the Service Provider by the contracting public Service Provider, under this contract, a penalty of \$50.00 for each person for each calendar day during which such person is discriminated against or intimidated in violation of the provisions of the contract; and

d. This contract may be canceled or terminated by the contracting public Service Provider, and all money due or to become due hereunder may be forfeited, for any violation of this section of the contract occurring after notice to the Service Provider from the contracting public Service Provider of any prior violation of this section of the contract.

No provision in this section shall be construed to prevent a board of education from designating that a contract, subcontract or other means of procurement of goods, services, equipment or construction shall be awarded to a small business enterprise, minority business enterprise or a women's business enterprise pursuant to P.L. [1985, c.490](#) (C.18A:18A-51 et seq.).

5. ASSURANCE OF COMPLIANCE FORM

During the performance of this contract, a contracted Service Provider may come in contact with school District students. The Board of Education fully understands its obligation to provide all students and staff members with a safe, educational environment. To this end, the Board of Education requires each respondent to sign a statement of Assurance of Compliance and acknowledge their understanding of the requirements listed below.

- Anti-Bullying Reporting—Requirement N.J.S.A. 18A:37-13.1 et seq.; N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.7 (c)
- Criminal History Background Checks N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.1
- Pre-Employment Requirements P.L. 2018 c.5, N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.6 et seq.

As part of this proposal, all respondents are requested to sign and submit the enclosed Assurance of Compliance Form, acknowledging their responsibilities to comply with the following laws and administrative code.

6. AWARD OF CONTRACT; RESOLUTION; NUMBER OF DAYS

Any contract awarded under this process shall be made by resolution of the Board of Education. The award must be made within sixty (60) days of the receipt of the proposals, however subject to extension pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.5(e).

7. BUSINESS REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE (N.J.S.A. 52:32-44)

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-44, the board of education is prohibited from entering into a contract with an entity unless the proposer/Service Provider, and each sub-Service Provider that is required by law to be named in a RFP/proposal/contract has a valid Business Registration Certificate on file with the Division of Revenue and Enterprise Services within the Department of the Treasury.

Request of the Board of Education

All Respondents or companies providing responses for requested proposals are **requested** to submit with their response package a copy of their “New Jersey Business Registration Certificate” as issued by the Department of Treasury of the State of New Jersey.

The Board reminds all respondents that failure to submit the New Jersey Business Registration Certificate prior to the award of contract will result in the rejection of the proposal.

Sub-Service Providers

Prior to contract award or authorization, the Service Provider shall provide the Contracting Service Provider with its proof of business registration and that of any named sub-Service Provider(s).

Sub-Service Providers named in a RFP or other proposal shall provide proof of business registration to the Respondent, who in turn, shall provide it to the District prior to the time a contract, purchase order, or other contracting document is awarded or authorized.

During the course of contract performance:

- (1) The Service Provider shall not enter into a contract with a sub-Service Provider unless the sub-Service Provider first provides the Service Provider with a valid proof of business registration.
- (2) The Service Provider shall maintain and submit to the District, a list of sub-Service Providers and their addresses that may be updated from time to time.
- (3) The Service Provider and any sub-Service Provider providing goods or performing services under the contract, and each of their affiliates, shall collect and remit to the Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the Treasury, the use tax due pursuant to the Sales and Use Tax Act, (N.J.S.A. 54:32B-1 et seq.) on all sales of tangible personal property delivered into the State. Before final payment is made under the contract, the Service Provider shall submit to the District, a complete and accurate list of all sub-Service Providers used and their addresses.

N.J.S.A. 54:49-4.1: Violations of Registration Requirements; Penalties.

A business organization that fails to provide a copy of a business registration as required pursuant to section 1 of P.L. [2001, c.134](#) (C.52:32-44 et al.) or subsection e. or f. of section 92 of P.L. 38. TAXES

If the Board determines that the Service Provider has failed to comply with the terms and conditions of the proposal upon which the issuance of the contract is based or that the Service Provider has failed to perform said service, duties and or responsibilities in a timely, proper, professional and/or efficient manner, then the Board shall have the authority to terminate the

contract upon written notice setting forth the reason for termination and effective date of termination.

Termination by the Board of the contract does not absolve the Service Provider from potential liability for damages caused the Board of Education by the Service Provider's breach of this agreement. The Board may withhold payment due the Service Provider and apply same towards damages once established. The Board will act diligently in accordance with governing statutes to mitigate damages. The Service Provider further agrees to indemnify and hold the Board harmless from any liability to sub-Service Providers or suppliers concerning work performed or goods provided arising out of the lawful termination of this agreement.

40. WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS

- Before The Proposal Opening

The School Business Administrator may consider a written request from a respondent to withdraw a proposal if the written request is received by the School Business Administrator before the advertised time of the proposal opening. The request to withdraw a proposal after the proposal opening may be reviewed by the School Business Administrator and/or other interested administrators' and/or the Board Attorney and a recommendation will be made to the Board of Education. 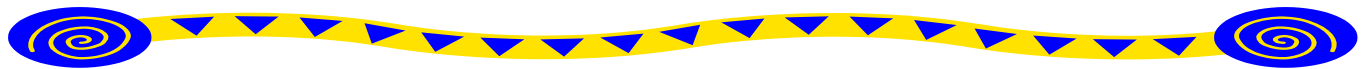

TITLE I, TITLE IIA, TITLE III, AND TITLE IV PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND TITLE I-PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT FOR PARENTS OF TITLE I NONPUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN LAKEWOOD

This Agreement is made the _____ day of _____ 2026 for services by and between the Lakewood Board of Education ("the "Board"), whose address is 200 Ramsey Avenue, Lakewood, New Jersey 08701, and _____, (the "Service Provider"), whose address is _____.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board desires to contract with the Service Provider, to provide **TITLE I, TITLE IIA, TITLE III, AND TITLE IV PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND TITLE I-PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT FOR PARENTS OF TITLE I NONPUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN LAKEWOOD** described in detail below; and

WHEREAS, the Board advertised for proposals for **TITLE I, TITLE IIA, TITLE III, AND TITLE IV PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND TITLE I-PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT FOR PARENTS OF TITLE I NONPUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN LAKEWOOD** ; and

WHEREAS, the Service Provider submitted qualifications for the Services and possesses the necessary skills and qualifications to contract with the Board to provide said Services; and

WHEREAS, on _____ 2026, the Board passed a resolution awarding such services to the Service Provider; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of both the Board and the Service Provider to enter into an Agreement whereby the Service Provider will provide the Services to the Board in accordance with applicable Federal and State law as well as the terms and conditions outlined in this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Service Provider and the Board, for the mutual promises and consideration herein specified, do-mutually covenant and agree as follows:

1. Scope and Nature of Services

Service Provider agrees to provide the Services to the Board. The Services shall be provided as set forth in the Technical Specifications of the RFP and the Board's Resolution dated _____ attached hereto.

2. Term

The Term of this Agreement shall be July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2029 (a period of three (3) years) with the possibility of renewal for two (2) one (1) year renewals or one (1) two (2) year renewal. Notwithstanding same, the Board engages the Services of Service Provider, and Service Provider agrees to provide all services as noted above, for the period during which schools are in session, generally commencing about September 1 through June 30.

3. Compensation- Payments shall be made in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-10.1

Service Provider is only entitled to compensation hereunder for specific Services performed. Service Provider shall not be entitled to compensation if Service Provider is scheduled to provide a Service and the Service is not provided as a result of an action or inaction of Service Provider, its agents, servants and/or employees. The Board shall use its best efforts to avoid cancellations of Services.

Service Provider shall only be entitled to be paid for Services actually rendered consistent with this Agreement, all Federal and State rules, regulations and authorized regulatory guidance applicable to the provision of the Services.

While the parties acknowledge and agree that Service Provider shall use its best efforts to provide the Services required herein as scheduled, in the event Service Provider is unable to adhere to the schedule of Services to be provided, Service Provider shall provide immediate notice to the Business Administrator/Board Secretary. Neither Service Provider nor the Board shall be subject to any default hereunder, fee, fine, or penalty or prejudice in the event that it is required to cancel the requested or scheduled Services.

Service Provider shall submit duly verified invoices for Services provided to the Board on a monthly basis (each a "Monthly Invoice"). The Board shall remit the payment on the Monthly Invoice to Service Provider as part of the Board's next regular bill list following the satisfactory completion of the Services actually provided, upon the submission and approval of said Monthly Invoices pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:19-1 et seq. and proper execution by Service Provider of vouchers and other documents which may be required for the proper fiscal management of the District. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-10.1 "A board of education, as defined in N.J.S.18A:18A-2, shall pay interest on the amount due a business concern pursuant to a properly executed invoice, when required, if the required payment is not made on or before the required payment date."

The Board shall release payment to the Service Provider in the month succeeding that in which the monthly, verified invoice is submitted and approved by the Administration, so long as the required documentation, including invoice, voucher and any requested supporting documents, has been provided to the District's Business Office by the 30th of the month succeeding that in which the Services were performed. Notwithstanding, and in addition to, any payment requirements set forth herein, final bills for Services rendered under this Agreement shall be submitted by August 1st of the fiscal school year succeeding the expiration of this Agreement for any Services performed in the month or months prior, to allow the District to review the payment request and release payment after a final accounting of Services and funds has been completed.

In the event the Board reasonably requests additional information in order to confirm an amount claimed on the Monthly Invoice, Service Provider agrees to provide same within five (5) business days of the request, or as soon thereafter as is possible. The Board/Administration will provide Service Provider with written correspondence explaining its reason for disputing a particular payment amount.

In the event the Board fails to make the required payments within the time period for payments provided herein, Service Provider shall have the right, in addition to any other remedies, to withhold the provision of further services and/or to terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Board. Notwithstanding any other notice, default and termination provisions herein, the Parties may agree, in writing by separate instrument, to modify this section to continue the provision of Services while outstanding payment issues are resolved.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no monthly payment will be made unless Service Provider has on file with the Board a list of all employees including each employee's certification/license status and position/location served.

4. Termination

The Agreement herein can be terminated by either party, and without regard to default, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice by the terminating party to the non-terminating party. The right to terminate this Agreement shall be without prejudice to, and with full reservation of, all other rights and remedies of the parties pursuant to this Agreement or as may exist at law or in equity, including, but not limited to specific performance. If the Agreement is terminated by the Board, the Board shall pay to Service Provider all amounts of approved Monthly invoices for Services provided up to and including the effective date of termination, provided Service Provider submits all required documentation that the Services were performed as appropriate and as required.

5. Availability of Funds

The parties recognize that payments by the Board to Service Provider under this Agreement are expressly dependent upon, and subject to the availability to the District of State Security funds. The Service Provider is aware that the District's receipt of State funds is expressly conditioned upon allocation, review and approval by the NJDOE. If the Board, for any reason, does not receive sufficient funds to make the required payments under this Agreement, it shall not be considered a breach of the Agreement by the Board and the parties shall immediately begin negotiations to modify this contract taking into account the availability of funds. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, the Board shall pay Service Provider for all services rendered through the date the Board notifies Service Provider of appropriation issues.

It is the sole responsibility of the Service Provider to keep track of each school's allocation of funds, which are provided on a monthly basis, for the Services set forth herein, and not exceed the allocation prior to the end of the school year. The Service Provider will not be paid should it deliver services in excess of a school's annual allocation.

6. Licensure

Service Provider shall provide the Board, upon the initial provision of Services and from time to time upon reasonable request, with copies of documentation confirming that Service Provider and anyone providing the Services on behalf of Service Provider has the certifications, licenses, skills and experience necessary to provide the Services. The documents shall be current, valid and issued by the State and/or any other authority having jurisdiction over the Services.

7. Criminal History Background Check.

Service Provider shall ensure that a Criminal History Background Check conducted by the NJDOE has been completed for anyone providing the Services hereunder as required by N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.1 et seq. Service Provider shall provide proof to the Board that no disqualifying record information exists as a condition precedent to the provision of services by anyone providing services pursuant to this Agreement. In the event Service Provider fails to comply with the Criminal History requirement, Board may, in its sole and absolute discretion, immediately terminate the Agreement, notwithstanding any other notice, default and termination provisions herein.

8. Laws

The failure to comply with any and all Local, County, State or Federal Law, rule, ordinance, regulation, code or Board policy shall be grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement at the Board's discretion. In addition, all Services provided under this Agreement must supplement student instructional services and programs. Should any Services provided under this Agreement be deemed by any State or Federal Service

Provider or authority to be non-compliant with State or Federal laws and/or regulations. Service Provider agrees to refund to the Board any amounts paid to Service Provider for such non-compliant Services. In the event that the Board decides to appeal any findings of non-compliance, no reimbursement shall be owed until the Board exhausts its right to appeal such findings, in its sole discretion, up to and including a first level appeal or beyond. Notwithstanding same, prior to any appeal being filed or any reimbursement becoming due under this Section, the parties agree to meet to discuss the feasibility of, and process for, filing of an appeal, at which time Service Provider shall provide any and all information in support of such appeal in its possession.

9. Confidentiality

In providing Services to the Board, Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it may acquire information that is confidential or proprietary in nature. Service Provider agrees that it

will not publish, disclose or use student records except as otherwise provided by law to anyone other than its employees or agents who must have access to such Confidential Information to perform its obligations hereunder, which employees or agents are subject to strict confidentiality obligations in strict accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.1 et seq., and the Federal Family Education Rights and Privacy Act.

The Board agrees that in the event it acquires Service Provider information that is confidential or proprietary in nature, it will not publish or use same without prior written consent of the Service Provider or as otherwise provided by law to anyone other than its employees or agents who must have access to such information to perform its obligations hereunder.

10. Independent Service Provider/Assignment

The parties agree that Service Provider and anyone providing the Services on behalf of Service Provider is an independent Service Provider and nothing in the Agreement shall be construed to establish an employer/employee, Service Provider, joint venture or partnership arrangement between the parties. In discharging all duties and obligations hereunder, Service Provider and anyone providing the Services on behalf of Service Provider shall at all times remain in an independent Service Provider relationship with the Board. The Board assumes no responsibility for the payment of compensation except as set forth herein and shall not be responsible for the payment or provision of, wages, benefits or taxes or pension contributions of Service Provider or any employees of Service Provider. Service Provider represents that they/them is not an employee according to the rules and regulations of the New Jersey State Department of Treasury, Division of Pensions and Benefits and shall indemnify and hold the Board harmless for any pension or other contributions.

The rights, duties and responsibilities of the Parties under this Agreement party may not be assigned, transferred, hypothecated or otherwise delegated, without the prior

written consent of the other party; except that Service Provider may assign this Agreement or any duty or obligation or performance or payment hereunder to its successor or any entity acquiring all or substantially all of the assets of Service Provider.

11. Limitation on Liability/Indemnification

Service Provider shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Board, collectively and individually, and its members, agents, officials, representatives and employees (each, a "Board Representative") from and against any and all damages, losses, or claims, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, that arise as a result, in whole or in part, from: (a) any intentional or negligent act, error, or omission of Service Provider, its employees, agents and/or servants or anyone for whose acts they may be liable arising out of this Agreement; (b) any breach of this Agreement by Service Provider or anyone performing the Services on behalf of Service Provider; (c) Service Provider's violation of, or failure to comply with any law, statute, regulation and/or code applicable to Service Provider's Services, in each case, due solely, or in material part, to Service Provider's conduct and not the Board's or District design or implementation of the program or actions of the Board or any Board Representative; or (d) any adverse audit findings that impact the amount the Board receives for state and/or federal aid if the reduction in state or federal aid is due solely, or in material part, to Service Provider's conduct (and that of its employees, agents, and/or servants) and not to the Board's design or implementation of the program.

In carrying out the provisions of this Agreement or in exercising any power or authority granted to them by their position, there shall be no liability upon any Board Representative, either personally or as officials of the Board, but only to the extent such Board Representative is acting in the course of the duties of such Board Representative.

12. Insurance Requirements

- A. Service Provider shall maintain or cause to be maintained, in full force and effect, insurance in such amounts and against such risks as follows:
- i. Broad form, comprehensive, or commercial General Liability Insurance coverage, including contractual liability, against claims for personal injury, death or property damage in an amount of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) with respect to injury or death of a single person and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in the aggregate, and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) with respect to property damage, together with Excess/Umbrella Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00), Fire Damage Insurance in an amount of not less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) and Medical Expense Insurance in an amount of not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00); and
 - ii. Workers Compensation Insurance coverage in the minimum amount required by the specifications for the Services as follows: Employer's Liability Insurance coverage in an amount not less than One Million Thousand Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for bodily injury caused by accident or disease and One Million Dollars

(\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence for automobile liability or in the statutory amount, whichever is greater; and

iii. Professional Liability Insurance coverage in an amount of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) with respect to a single claim and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) in the aggregate, which the Service Provider shall maintain for no less than six (6) years following completion of Services.

B. No later than the execution of this Agreement, and upon the Board's reasonable request from time to time, the Service Provider shall provide to the Board a certificate of insurance evidencing the coverage set forth above from an insurance company authorized to do business in New Jersey and having an A.M. Best Rating of at least an "A-". The Service Provider shall also provide, upon the Board's request, full and complete copies of the insurance policies required above.

C. The coverage set forth above shall name the Lakewood Board of Education as an additional insured under any policies required to be provided pursuant to this section.

13. Default

In the event either party fails to provide any of the Services or fulfill any of its responsibilities required under this Agreement, that party shall be deemed to be in default of this Agreement and the non-defaulting party shall be entitled to maintain any and all actions and effect any and all remedies available to it in equity and in law. The parties may not maintain any action or effect any remedies for default against the defaulting party unless and until the defaulting party has failed to cure the breach within thirty (30) days of written notice of such breach, or if the nature of the cure is such that it reasonably requires more than thirty (30) days, if the defaulting party commences the cure within the thirty (30) day period and thereafter continuously and diligently pursues the cure to completion.

14. Notices.

15. Dispute Resolution

Any and all claims, disputes or other matters in question between the Board and Service Provider arising out of or relating to the Agreement, or alleged breach thereof, shall be subject to and determined by a court of competent jurisdiction venue in Ocean County, New Jersey. Service Provider hereby knowingly irrevocably waives its right to trial by jury in any action arising out of or relating to the Agreement. This waiver does not apply to personal injury actions or to any action in which another party, not bound by such a waiver, demands trial by jury. This waiver is knowingly, intentionally and voluntarily made by Service Provider. If a dispute arises between the Board and any entity or individual as to which the Board is bound to the arbitration of such disputes and the dispute directly or indirectly relates to the Agreement, then Service Provider agrees that Service Provider can be joined as a party to such arbitration with respect to matters related to such arbitration. Any and all disputes which exist only between the Board and

Service Provider, or among the Board, Service Provider and others as to which the Board is not bound to the arbitration of disputes, shall be subject to the provisions of this Section.

16. Non-Collusion

Service Provider has not, directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement or participated in any collusion in connection with the Agreement in violation of federal or State law, and

warrants that no person has been employed or retained to solicit or secure such contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, except bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by Service Provider.

17. Business Registration

Service Provider shall remit a copy of its Business Registration Certificate to the Board concurrent prior to the award of the contract.

18. Pay-to-Play

The Service Provider shall comply with the provisions of the New Jersey Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq. and shall submit the required Disclosure forms to the Board prior to the execution of this Agreement within the time required by law.

19. Records Maintenance and Retention

The Service Provider and anyone providing the Services on behalf of the Service Provider shall retain any and all records in accordance with the applicable School Board Retention Schedule promulgated by the New Jersey Division of Archives and Records Management. Any and all records, progress reports, notes and other documents related to the provision of the Services shall be immediately provided to the Board

at the termination of the Agreement. Upon turnover of the records, Service Provider's responsibility to maintain the records shall cease to the extent permitted by the State records retention requirements.

20. Audit and Inspection

The Service Provider shall maintain all records pertaining to the Services under this Agreement in accordance with the then applicable New Jersey State Records Retention Schedule and agrees that the Board and federal and state authorities and their respective auditors shall have the right to examine all books, records and documents pertaining to the Services and charges provided under this Agreement (collectively, the "Materials") upon the Board's reasonable request from time to time. Service Provider agrees to supply the District one copy of the Materials requested by the Board to support and verify Service Provider's claims for payment, as set forth in Paragraph 3, at no cost to the Board. The cost of reproducing additional copies of the Materials already submitted to the Board shall be borne by the Board, upon submission of an invoice by Service Provider to the Board. The Board shall designate a person to whom Service Provider shall submit all documents.

21. Sales and Use Tax

The Service Provider shall collect and remit to the New Jersey Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of Treasury, the use tax due pursuant to the "Sales and Use Tax Act," P.L. 1966, C. 30 (C.54:32:B-1 et seq.) on all of their sales of tangible personal property delivered into the State of New Jersey, regardless of whether the tangible personal property is intended for a contract with a contracting Service Provider. This tax shall be remitted for the term of the Agreement.

22. Law Against Discrimination (LAD)

The Parties to this Agreement do hereby agree that the provisions of N.J.S.A. 10:2-1 through N.J.S.A. 10:2-4, dealing with discrimination in employment on public contracts and the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, are hereby made a part of this Agreement and are binding upon them. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 10:2-1 through 10:2-4, during the performance of this Agreement, Service Provider agrees as follows:

- a. In the hiring of persons for the performance of work under this contract or any subcontract hereunder, or for the procurement, manufacture, assembling or furnishing

of any such materials, equipment, supplies or services to be acquired under this contract, no Service Provider, nor any person acting on behalf of such Service Provider or sub-Service Provider, shall, by reason of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, gender identity or expression, affectional or sexual orientation or sex, discriminate against any person who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates;

- b. No Service Provider, sub-Service Provider, nor any person on his behalf shall, in any manner, discriminate against or intimidate any employee engaged in the performance of work under this contract or any subcontract hereunder, or engaged in the procurement, manufacture, assembling or furnishing of any such materials, equipment, supplies or services to be acquired under such contract, on account of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, gender identity or expression, affectional or sexual orientation or sex;
- c. There may be deducted from the amount payable to Service Provider by the contracting public Service Provider, under this Agreement, a penalty of \$50.00 for each person for each calendar day during which such person is discriminated against or intimidated in violation of the provisions of the Agreement; and
- d. This Agreement may be canceled or terminated by the contracting public Service Provider and all money due or to become due hereunder may be forfeited, for any violation of this section of the contract occurring after notice to Service Provider from the contracting public Service Provider of any prior violation of this section of the Agreement.

No provision in this section shall be construed to prevent a board of education from designating that a contract, subcontract or other means of procurement of goods, services, equipment or construction shall be awarded to a small business enterprise, minority business enterprise or a women's business enterprise pursuant to P.L.1985, c. 490 (C.18A:18A-51 et seq.)

All complaints of violation of the above shall be made to the Attorney General or their representative within the Department of Law and Public Safety authorized by him to act in the matter, within one hundred eighty (180) days after the date the alleged violation occurred.

23. Equal Employment Opportunity

During the performance of this Agreement, the Service Provider agrees to comply with the terms of the Mandatory Equal Employment Opportunity Language annexed hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated as if set forth herein.

24. Force Majeure

Neither party shall bear any responsibility or liability for any losses arising out of any delay or interruption of their performance of obligations under this Agreement due to any act of God, act of governmental authority, act of the public enemy, or due to war, riot, flood, civil commotion, insurrection, severe or adverse weather conditions, lack or shortage of electrical power not due to the fault of the non-performing party, malfunctions of equipment or software programs or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the party delayed. In the event Service Provider is unable to perform as a result of a Force Majeure, it shall endeavor to provide "make up" days at the

affected school locations at no additional cost to the Board. If the Force Majeure event continues beyond five (5) days, the Board may cancel this Agreement immediately upon written notice to Service Provider so long as the event is continuing as of the date of cancellation.

25. Entire Agreement

This Agreement, along with the Exhibits and Schedules hereto and the terms of the proposal requirements and Service Provider's response, incorporates the parties' entire agreement and complete understanding concerning the terms and conditions of Service Provider's retention by the Board. This Agreement may not be modified or amended in whole or in part except by agreement of both parties and by Board ratification.

26. Legal Counsel

Service Provider acknowledges that it has been informed of its right to be represented by legal counsel regarding the negotiation, development, and approval of this Agreement and that the Board's legal counsel does not represent the Service Provider in the matter.

27. Amendment

Service Provider agrees to negotiate amendments to this Agreement as required by the Board in order to comply with any applicable law.

28. New Jersey Law

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the provisions of the laws of New Jersey. Service Provider additionally agrees to observe and comply with any and all rules, regulations, official guidance documents or policies promulgated thereunder by the New Jersey or United States Departments of Education.

29. Subcontracting and Assignment

- a. The Service Provider shall not subcontract and/or assign Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement without prior written approval from the School Business Administrator.
- b. In the event that such approval is given by the School Business Administrator, all subcontracts entered into by the Provider shall include a provision whereby the Sub-Service Provider acknowledges its obligation to make all pertinent records available to the School District, NJDOE, the Department of Children and Families and any state or federal Service Provider whose funds are expended in the course of this Agreement, and who would otherwise have a right to review such records, as necessary, and that the Sub-Service Provider agrees to abide by the terms of this Agreement to the extent practicable

30. Compliance with School Ethics Act

Service Provider represents that, to the best of its knowledge, information and belief, none of its employees is engaged in conduct that constitutes a conflict of interest under, or a violation of, the School Ethics Act, N.J.S.A. 18A:12-21, et. seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:28-1.1, et seq.

31. Incorporation of Proposal Specifications

The contract requirements and Service Provider's response thereto, as more fully set forth in the response and the Proposal Specifications and General and Technical Conditions, and related attachments, as advertised for the Services herein, shall be considered attached to this Agreement as an exhibit as if fully set forth herein and shall have the same effect as if contained within a contractual provision in this Agreement.

32. Performance Bond –NOT APPLICABLE

33. Board Approval

This Agreement is subject to the approval of the Lakewood Board of Education. Upon such approval, the Board President is authorized to sign the Agreement on behalf of the Board.

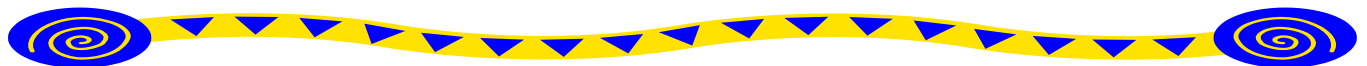

A. Purpose of Proposal

The Lakewood Board of Education seeks qualified Service Providers to provide Professional Development activities and parental involvement activities to nonpublic school teachers and parents of students in Kindergarten through grade 12. Under the Title I program, Professional Development activities should enrich teacher knowledge and provide opportunities to nonpublic school teachers of Title I participants to increase their skills and knowledge regarding providing instruction to Title I children. Under the Title II, Part A program, nonpublic school teachers, principals, and other educational personnel are eligible to participate in Professional Development activities expected to improve student academic achievement. Under the Title III program teachers, are instructed on how to develop high-quality language instruction to limited English proficient children. Under the Title IV program, Professional Development activities support Well-Rounded Educational Opportunities, Safe and Healthy Students, and the effective use of technology. Under Title I Parental Involvement, parents of Title I students are eligible to participate in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving their child's academic learning and other school activities, including and ensuring:

1. That parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning
2. That parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child

B. Background

The Lakewood Board of Education serves approximately 159 nonpublic schools. About 98 percent of these schools are separated by gender, creating a unique target audience at each school.

C. Scope of Service

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT. —the term “Professional Development” means activities that—

(A) are an integral part of school and local educational agency strategies for providing educators (including teachers, principals, other school leaders, specialized instructional support personnel, paraprofessionals, and, as applicable, early childhood educators) with the knowledge and skills necessary to enable students to succeed in a well-rounded education and to meet the challenging State academic standards; and

(B) are sustained (not stand-alone, 1-day, or short term workshops), intensive, collaborative, job-embedded, data-driven, and classroom-focused, and may include activities that improve and increase teachers’—

- knowledge of the academic subjects the teachers teach;

- understanding of how students learn; and
- ability to analyze student work and achievement from multiple sources, including how to adjust instructional strategies, assessments, and materials based on such analysis;
 - (ii) are an integral part of broad nonpublic school wide and districtwide educational improvement plans;
 - (iii) allow personalized plans for each educator to address the educator’s specific needs identified in observation or other feedback;
 - (iv) improve classroom management skills;
 - (v) support the recruitment, hiring, and training of effective teachers, including teachers who became certified through State and local alternative routes to certification;
 - (vi) advance teacher understanding of—
- effective instructional strategies that are evidence-based; and
- strategies for improving student academic achievement or substantially increasing the knowledge and teaching skills of teachers;
 - (vii) are aligned with, and directly related to, academic goals of the nonpublic school or local educational agency;
 - (viii) are developed with extensive participation of teachers, principals, other school leaders, parents, representatives of Indian tribes (as applicable), and administrators of schools to be served under this Act;
 - (ix) are designed to give teachers of English learners, and other teachers and instructional staff, the knowledge and skills to provide instruction and appropriate language and academic support services approved under Title I, II, III & IV to those children, including the appropriate use of curricula and assessments;
 - (x) to the extent appropriate, provide training for teachers, principals, and other school leaders in the use of technology (including education about the harms of copyright piracy), so that technology and technology applications are effectively used in the classroom to improve teaching and learning in the curricula and academic subjects in which the teachers teach;
 - (xi) as a whole, are regularly evaluated for their impact on increased teacher effectiveness and improved student academic achievement, with the findings of the evaluations used to improve the quality of Professional Development;
 - (xii) are designed to give teachers of children with disabilities or children with developmental delays, and other teachers and instructional staff, the knowledge and skills to provide instruction and academic support services, to those children, including positive behavioral interventions and supports, multi-tier system of supports, and use of accommodations;
 - (xiii) include instruction in the use of data and assessments to

- inform and instruct classroom practice;
- (xiv) include instruction in ways that teachers, principals, other school leaders, specialized instructional support personnel, and school administrators may work more effectively with parents and families;
 - (xv) involve the forming of partnerships with institutions of higher education, including, as applicable, Tribal Colleges and Universities as defined in section 316(b) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1059c(b)), to establish school-based teacher, principal, and other school leader training programs that provide prospective teachers, novice teachers, principals, and other school leaders with an opportunity to work under the guidance of experienced teachers, principals, other school leaders, and faculty of such institutions;
 - (xvi) create programs to enable paraprofessionals (assisting teachers employed by a local educational agency receiving assistance under part A of title I) to obtain the education necessary for those paraprofessionals to become certified and licensed teachers;
 - (xvii) provide follow-up training to teachers who have participated in activities described in this paragraph that are designed to ensure that the knowledge and skills learned by the teachers are implemented in the classroom; and
 - (xviii) where practicable, provide jointly for school staff and other early childhood education program providers, to address the transition to elementary school, including issues related to school readiness.

Title I Professional Development:

1. The Professional Development activities for nonpublic school teachers shall focus on how those teachers can serve Title I participants better, such as by providing information on research-based English Language Arts, Mathematics Instruction, Foreign Language, and Social and Emotional Learning (SEL).
2. It is inappropriate to use these funds to upgrade the instructional program in the regular classroom of the nonpublic school. Nonpublic school teachers and paraprofessionals of Title I participants are eligible to attend Title I Professional Development activities; however, administrators are not eligible. Any materials purchased must support Title I instructional, Professional Development and parental involvement programs and remain under the control of the Lakewood Board of Education and be properly labeled as Property of the Lakewood Board of Education.

Title IIA Professional Development:

1. Activities to be carried out for nonpublic school personnel must be based on a review of scientifically based research and must be expected to improve student academic achievement.
2. Activities shall improve the knowledge of teachers, principals, and other educational personnel in one or more of the core academic subjects (i.e. Math, English/Language Arts, etc.) and in effective instructional teaching strategies, methods, and skills. Examples of Title IIA Professional Development may include:
 - a. Training in effectively integrating technology into curricula and instruction;
 - b. Training in how to teach students with different needs, including students with disabilities or limited English proficiency, and gifted and talented students;
 - c. Training in methods of improving student behavior, identifying early and appropriate interventions, and involving parents more effectively in their children's education;
 - d. Leadership development and management training to improve the quality of principals and superintendents; and Training in the use of data and assessments to improve instruction and student outcomes.

Title III Professional Development:

1. Title III PD activities shall be designed:
 - a. To assist in the development of high-quality language instruction educational programs in teaching limited English proficient children.
 - b. To assist in developing and enhancing nonpublic schools' capacity to establish, implement and sustain language instruction educational programs and programs of English language development for limited English proficient children to enter all-English instruction settings.
 - c. Collaborate with nonpublic teachers in creating individual and unit lessons that focus on sequencing, modeling, and conceptual understanding.
 - d. Conference with individuals and groups of nonpublic teachers to enhance their content knowledge and pedagogical practice.

Title I, II, III Teacher/Parent Coaching/Mentoring:

1. Coaching is similar to Title I, II, and III Professional Development but with 3 or less Teacher/Parents in attendance. Activities involved will focus on improving/introducing knowledge and techniques to help Title students improve in core content areas, as well as, providing methods to improve student behavior, being able to identify learning issues and understanding interventions that can be used.
2. Mentoring is a one-on-one support for up to 3 novice or less experienced educator by a more experienced educator.
3. A plan and request for Mentoring should be developed and submitted NO LATER than October 31st except:
 - a. If the novice teacher is hired any time after October 1, the plan and request should be developed within 25 calendar days of hire date.
4. Sessions of Coaching/Mentoring for Teachers not to exceed 50 hours per school year and Coaching/Mentoring for Parents not to exceed 10 hours per school year and will provide:
 - a. Activity/training.
 - b. Collaboration with teacher and parents.
 - c. On-going training

Title IV Professional Development:

1. Activities designed to boost student achievement in three key areas:
 - a. Well-Rounded Education (WRE)
 - b. Safe and Healthy Students (SHS)
 - c. Effective Use of Technology (EUT)
2. Title IV Professional development may be conducted to support activities listed in the table below:

For example, Professional development and training can be offered to school and specialized instructional support personnel and interested community members in prevention, education, early identification, intervention mentoring, recovery support services and, where appropriate, rehabilitation referral, as related to drug and violence prevention;

4. Professional development to support Effective Use of Technology may be conducted to support activities listed below:

- a. Initial and ongoing Professional Development opportunities for teachers, principals, other school leaders, or other personnel involved in a blended learning project that is designed to support the implementation and academic success of the blended learning project.
- b. Providing Professional Development in the use of technology to enable teachers and instructional leaders to increase student achievement in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, including computer science.

For all Professional Development, the following is required:

1. All resumes, agendas, handouts, and Professional Development (PD) files shall be submitted to the district for approval *at least two weeks /14 calendar days before a proposed event.*
2. All PDs shall occur on the same date and time listed on the approval form. *Proposed changes to the date, time, and/or source of funding shall be submitted to the district at least 48 to 72 hours before the event via email. Any change that has taken place AFTER that time frame will not be accepted.*

District grant employees shall be granted open access to attend all PD activities.

3. Professional development activities, should be sustained, (not stand-alone, one-day, or short term workshops), intensive, collaborative, job embedded, data-driven, and classroom-focused.
4. All PD must include Scientifically Based Research as described below:
 - a. Employs systematic, empirical methods that draw on observation or experiment;
 - b. Involves rigorous data analyses that are adequate to test the stated hypotheses and justify the general conclusions drawn;
 - c. Relies on measurements or observational methods that provide reliable and valid data across evaluators and observers, across multiple measurements and observations, and across studies by the same or different investigators;
 - d. Is evaluated using experimental or quasi-experimental designs in which individuals, entities, programs, or activities are assigned to different conditions and with appropriate controls to evaluate the effects of the condition of interest, with a preference for random-assignment experiments, or other designs to the extent that those designs contain within-condition or across-condition controls;
 - e. Ensures that experimental studies are presented in sufficient detail and clarity to allow for replication or, at a minimum, offer the opportunity to build systematically on their findings; and
 - f. Has been accepted by a peer-reviewed journal or approved by a panel

of independent experts through a comparably rigorous, objective, and scientific review (Note: practitioner journals or education magazines are not the same as peer-reviewed academic journals.)

Title I Parental Involvement (PI):

1. Title I Parental Involvement (PI) events focus on how parents can academically help their Title I child. The Service Provider shall perform the following efforts to the satisfaction of the district.
 - a. shall provide assistance to parents of Title I children, as appropriate, in understanding such topics as the state's academic content standards and State student academic achievement standards, state and local academic assessments; also monitor a child's progress and work with educators to improve the achievement of their children;
 - b. shall provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve individual achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement;
 - c. shall educate parents, in the value and utility of their contributions; and how to communicate and work as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school;
 - d. shall, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parent involvement programs; conduct other activities such as parent resource centers that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children;
 - e. shall ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents of participating children in a format that is practicable and in a language that parents can understand;

All Professional Development (PD) and Parental Involvement (PI) activities

1. All PD and PI activities shall advance the teachers' and parents' understanding of effective instructional strategies that are based on: Scientifically based research, on improving student academic achievement or substantially increasing the knowledge and teaching skills of teachers, and are aligned with and directly related to State academic content standards, student academic achievement standards, and assessments, and the curricula and programs tied to the standards. The term 'scientifically based research'

means research that involves the application of rigorous, systematic, and objective procedures to obtain reliable and valid knowledge relevant to education activities and programs.

2. All educational services or other benefits, including materials and equipment, shall be secular, neutral and non-ideological.
3. All PD activities must be delivered by a live presenter. Audio/audio-visual presentations will not be considered as such.
4. Title funds may be used to pay for stipends for nonpublic school teachers, if reasonable and necessary.

For example, if the Professional Development activity is conducted during after-school hours or in the summer, stipends may be used to compensate teachers for their participation outside their regular employment hours. Stipends for nonpublic school teachers must be paid directly to the nonpublic school teachers for their own use and not to the nonpublic school.

5. A teacher stipend of \$45 per hour may be billed for teachers who attend Professional Development outside of their contracted hours with submission of a verification letter from the nonpublic school administrator. Service Providers administrative fee cannot exceed 6% of the teacher reimbursement.
6. Title funds for participation of nonpublic school teachers in Professional Development activities shall not be used to pay or subsidize any portion of a nonpublic school teacher's salary or benefits.

The law requires that all uses of Title funds supplement and not supplant non-federal funds that would otherwise be used for activities. Hence, the Professional Development provided with Title funds needs to be in addition to, and not in place of, what the nonpublic school would otherwise provide.

The below dress code of instructors, presenters, and/or counselors shall strictly be adhered to.

Appropriate dress for female staff:

- Dresses and skirts must cover the knee with no slits.
- Pants/shorts may not be worn.
- No jeans or jean clothing of any color are acceptable.
- Shirts must cover the elbow and collar bone. No V-neck or scoop should be worn.
- Flip-flops or sandals should not be worn. Only closed toe shoes should be worn.
- Socks or stockings should be worn.
- Earrings on females are the only visible piercing allowed.
- Clothing should not be form fitting or tight.
- No Tattoos should be exposed.

Appropriate dress for male staff:

- Men must wear a dress shirt and pants.
- Shorts are not acceptable.
- No jeans or jean shirts of any color are acceptable.
- Flip-flops or sandals should not be worn. Only closed toe shoes should be worn.
- Socks should be worn.
- T-shirts or tank tops are not allowed.
- No earrings or piercings allowed.
- Clothing should be conventional and conservative.
- No Tattoos should be exposed

7. Professional Development and Parental Involvement activities may be conducted within the nonpublic school or public facilities/locations but shall not be permitted in a private residence or any area not generally available to the general public.
8. *Employees of the Lakewood Board of Education shall be provided with open access to attend all Professional Development and Parental Involvement activities. *

D. Qualifications of Respondents

- a) Respondents shall provide employees who have a minimum of five (5) years of education and Professional Development experience in at least three (3) public and/or nonpublic schools.
- b) Respondents shall provide at a minimum, four (4) employees holding an active New Jersey Teaching Certificate.
- c) Respondents shall provide employees with educational experience in providing the required services.
- d) Respondents shall have at a minimum, three (3) years of educational consulting experience in public and/or nonpublic schools.

E. Contract Period

The term of the contract will be from **July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2029**, with possible options for two additional 1-year renewals or one additional 2-year renewal as unilaterally determined by the Board of Education and as allowed by law.

F. Coordination of Activities

All efforts and assessment of performance shall be coordinated through the Director of Grants for the Lakewood Board of Education.

The District reserves its rights to audit and/or observe any Professional Development

or Parental Involvement effort, and admittance shall not be withheld.

G. Fee Schedule – Payment

Professional Development (PD) or Parental Involvement (PI) activities conducted with three or fewer participants will be considered teacher/parent coaching/mentoring activities.

- The cost of teacher/mentoring/coaching activities **shall not exceed \$150 per hour. Teacher mentoring/coaching should not exceed 50 hours per school year /\$7,500.**
- The cost of parent/mentoring/coaching activities **shall not exceed \$150 per hour. Parental mentoring/coaching should not exceed 10 hours per parent /\$1,500.**

PD or PI activities conducted with three or more participants will be considered Professional Development workshops. All Professional Development workshops must take place either in a nonpublic school or a Lakewood School District facility.

- The respondents must enter a per-hour amount on the Proposal Form based on the presenter’s level of education for Professional Development taking place in schools.
 - Proposed per-hour price of services for presenters with a MA/MS or higher, **not to exceed \$650 per hour, not to exceed 6 hours pr presentation/\$3900-**
 - Proposed per-hour price of services for presenters with a BA/BS or less, **not to exceed \$500 per hour, not to exceed 6 hours per presentation/\$3000-**
- The respondents must enter a per registrant amount for Professional Development that is open to the public on the Proposal Form.
 - PD up to 3 hours should not exceed **\$100 per person, capped at 50 participants, not to exceed \$5000-**
 - PD up to 6 hours should not exceed **\$200 per person, capped at 50 participants, not to exceed \$10,000.**

PLEASE NOTE:

****Prior to an open-to-the -public Professional Development, the Service Provider must inform the district of the minimum and maximum number of attendants expected to participate in the event. Thereafter, the Service Provider will provide the number of participants actually signed up for the event no less than 24 hours before the event.

**** Before an open-to-the -public Professional Development, the Service Provider must provide a rationale from the nonpublic school

as to why the number of participants attending is required.

- Hotel, travel, and meal expenses shall not be included in the proposed cost nor will such costs be allowable for payment or reimbursement. The Service Provider shall provide a.) sign-in sheets with attendees' printed names and signatures b.) dated workshop evaluation forms. All documents shall be original and requested in BLUE INK.
- A teacher reimbursement fee of \$45 per hour may be billed in the next billing cycle for teachers who attend Professional Development outside of their contracted hours, with submission of a verification letter from the nonpublic school administrator. Service Providers' administrative fee cannot exceed 6% of the teacher reimbursement.

H. Presentation Package - (Evaluative Criteria)

All proposals will be judged on the basis of the district's pre-determined, merit-based evaluative criteria as outlined within the RFP and Technical Specifications. The criteria are:

- I. Technical Criteria
- II. Management Criteria
- III. Cost Criteria

Evaluation Process – Weighting and Scoring of Proposals

The weighting of criteria below reflects the district's determination of the respective significance in relationship to each of the criteria areas. The proposals will be evaluated and scored accordingly.

All RFP responses are to be evaluated on the basis of whose response is the most advantageous to the district, price and other factors considered, and whose response will provide the highest quality of service at fair and competitive prices.

The Board of Education will use a one hundred (100) point system in evaluating all proposals. The criteria to be evaluated are identified below:

*The office of the School Business Administrator will assist in the evaluation of the cost criteria.

Technical Criteria

Respondents shall provide a syllabus for each of the workshops they could provide as outlined under “Scope of Service” within this technical specification. Details on the topics should be provided and an agenda stating the goals and objectives as well as an outline of the material and content that will be covered for each topic.

Respondents shall also provide evidence of how Professional Development of similar type that was scientifically researched based was provided to other public and nonpublic schools in New Jersey. Success stories only please. Respondents, by submitting a proposal acknowledged that they fully understand the scope of service, work connectivity to be performed. Respondents are to provide evidence of any innovation and/or successful approach in providing the training requested.

Management Criteria

Business organization

1) The respondent shall submit a full description of the business organization to include, at minimum:

- a) Name, address, phone, fax, website, email address and other information of the professional firm or individual;
- b) An organizational chart noting the names of all principals and partners;
- c) Resumes of key staff members that will be assigned to provide the requested services
- d) A list of previous clients for the past five years.
- e) Recommendation letters from at least 1 public school district and 3 private schools with similar demographics to Lakewood.
- f) Copies of all professional and/or educational licenses that are required to perform the services as listed in the specifications;
- g) List of any judgments within the last three years and/or a list of bankruptcy or organization proceedings within the last 10 years;
- h) Availability of personnel, facilities, equipment and other resources to provide the services requested; and
- i) Any other information concerning the company that would assist the District in the evaluation process.

Costs Criteria - Fee Proposals

Respondents are to submit an hourly fee and per registrant proposal that complements the service that is being requested by the school district. The district

requires that all proposals be submitted as outlined above in item H.

The fee provided by the respondent shall be a significant part of the evaluation process as conducted by the district and respondent shall provide a full detailed analysis of their fee proposal.

Evaluation of Proposals - Evaluation Committee

The selected evaluation committee will include members who are familiar with the needs for services to be performed in the request for proposal. Committee members will be identified in the final report submitted to the board and also in the award of contract resolution. Evaluation Committee members will also complete a Conflict of Interest Statement in compliance with:

In accordance with the Office of State Comptroller's publication Best Practices for Awarding Services Contracts

Section 4 – (The Need for an Evaluation Committee), it has been determined that the evaluators:

“ . . . are sufficiently qualified to evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of the proposals submitted.”

“ . . . have the relevant experience necessary to evaluate the proposal;” and

“ . . . Are familiar with the need for the services to be performed in the request for proposals.”

I. Award of Contract

It is the intention of the Lakewood Board of Education to award **up to** four (4) contract(s) to four different respondent(s) whose response is the most advantageous to the Lakewood Board of Education, price and other factors considered and who will provide the highest quality service. Award(s) will be made to the four highest scoring respondent(s). Each Nonpublic School will select the Service Provider of their choice from this pool of awarded Service Providers to provide services for the duration of this contract.

A minimum score of 75 shall be necessary for consideration for award.

The Board of Education will use a one hundred (100) point system in evaluating all proposals. Any averaged total score below 75 will automatically be disqualified. The Nonpublic Schools will then perform an evaluation based on the same scoring criteria as used by the District.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C 5:34-4.3 “Prior to evaluating the proposals, each individual participating in the evaluation of a proposal shall execute a statement in accordance with [N.J.A.C. 5:34-4.3(e)] certifying they do not have a conflict of interest. This form will be provided to the Nonpublic Schools. Pursuant N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.5 “failure to meet the requirements of the request for proposals may result in the

Board of education disqualifying the Service Provider from further consideration. Under no circumstances shall the provisions of a proposal be subject to negotiation by the Board of education.”

After determination of all qualified Respondents by the Board of Education, a Service Provider selection process will be conducted by all nonpublic schools intending to use these services. The following page will explain the process used for each nonpublic school’s Service Provider selection. As a result of nonpublic school selections Title I, IIA, III and IV allocations per school will be awarded to selected Respondents and become part of their service contract.

The scoring criteria used for the Nonpublic School Service Provider selection process will be the same as used by the Lakewood School District as follows:

Each Nonpublic school will receive a copy of the proposals deemed qualified by the District and perform their own evaluation, choosing the Service Provider whose proposal is the most advantageous price and other factors considered.

The selected Service Provider must be able to provide Instructional Services for all schools that have selected them; however, one Service Provider is not expected to provide Instructional services for an excessive number of NP schools. Accordingly, in the event that Fifty Percent (50%) of NP schools chose the same Service Provider then Lakewood BOE will initiate a Redistribution of Schools Clause as follows:

Redistribution of Schools Clause

In order to ensure equitable distribution of services and to prevent overextension of any single Service Provider, the Lakewood Board of Education (“BOE”) will implement the following redistribution process if more than 50% of the Nonpublic (NP) schools select the same Service Provider for Instructional services:

- 1. Initial Assignment**
 - All NP schools will be assigned to their Service Provider of choice, subject to the Service Provider cap of 50% of all schools.
- 2. Capacity Review**
 - In the event that the number of NP schools selecting the same Service Provider exceeds the cap, the BOE Purchasing Office will review the assignments.
 - The review will prioritize assignments using the following objective criteria:
 - a. **School Size:** Larger schools with higher student enrollment and greater service demand will remain with their first-choice Service Provider.
 - b. **Specialized Needs:** Schools whose students require unique services or specialized expertise will remain with the Service Provider best suited to provide such services.
 - c. **Geographic Efficiency:** Assignments will be balanced to minimize travel distances and maximize Service Provider efficiency.
- 3. Redistribution Protocol**
 - Schools above the cap will be reassigned to other qualified Respondents.

- Reassignments will begin with smaller schools or those with more flexible service needs to reduce disruption.
 - Alternate Respondents must meet all RFP requirements and be approved for service delivery.
4. **Notification and Transparency**
- Schools that are reassigned will be notified in writing of the change and the rationale for reassignment.
 - The BOE will maintain a written record of all Service Provider selections, redistribution decisions, and the objective factors applied. This record will be available for review by oversight entities, including the NJDOE and the Office of the State Comptroller (OSC).
5. **Final Authority**
- The Lakewood BOE retains final authority for Service Provider assignments to ensure program quality, service capacity, and compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

Tie Breaker Policy

In the event that two or more proposals receive identical evaluation scores, the following tie-breaking criteria will be applied in order, i.e., if Policy #1 is successful the tie is broken and no further policy should be followed. If not, then the procedure will continue until the tie is broken.

1. Lowest Total Cost - Preference will be given to the proposal offering the lower overall cost to the district.
2. Supplier Diversity- If still tied, preference will be given to certified small, minority owned, women-owned, or veteran owned businesses.
3. Past Performance - If applicable, the district will consider past performance in any school district and possible requested references from other school districts to determine the award.
4. Random Selection - If all criteria above are equal, the district will determine the award by random selection, conducted in a fair and transparent manner. A random coin toss is a fair option to leave the ultimate decision to chance.

NP School Selection Process

Cost Criteria

- NP schools receive a copy of the awarded Service Providers with:
 - A copy of the proposals deemed qualified by the District.
 - Rates or pricing sheets.
 - Contact and ordering information.

Technical Criteria

- NP schools submit a **Service Provider Selection Form** to the district after their evaluation and ranking of Respondents is completed, indicating their evaluation results. It will also include:
 - Name of chosen Service Provider.
 - Justification (e.g., specialization, language services, experience).
 - Scope of services being requested.

Management Criteria

- The district reviews each NP school's selection for:
 - Alignment with the requested scope of work.
 - Budget/funding availability.
 - Compliance with applicable Title or IDEA regulations.
- Once verified, the district authorizes the Service Provider to provide services.

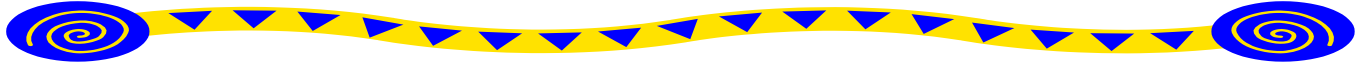
Documentation and Monitoring

- Services rendered are monitored for:
 - Performance.
 - Compliance with grant goals.
 - Fiscal accountability.

Annual Renewal and Feedback

- The district reviews Service Provider performance annually.
- NP schools may submit feedback for inclusion in future RFP cycles.

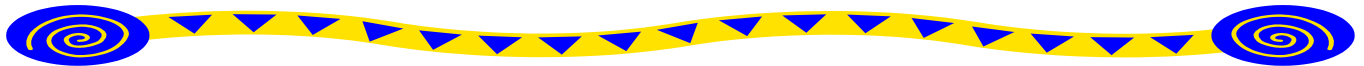

Federal Contract Requirements/Certifications

The Board of Education and the Service Provider acknowledge that this Contract is funded in part or entirely by the Federal Government and the parties agree to comply with all sections of the **Federal Uniform Administrative Requirements 2 CFR Part 200 et seq.**

Specific Contract Requirements

The Service Provider shall comply with all aspects of the Board's Specifications and General Requirements for Goods and Services Contracts as pertain to this Contract. In the event of a conflict between the said Specifications and General Requirements, the Public School Contracts Law at N.J.S.A. 18A: 18A-1 et seq. and Federal Procurement Regulations, the stricter requirements shall govern.

ALL CONTRACTS, AWARDED BY A RECIPIENT, INCLUDING SMALL PURCHASES, SHALL CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS AS APPLICABLE:

Equal Employment Opportunity –*If the contract exceeds \$10,000, it shall* contain a provision requiring compliance with E.O. 11246 – Equal Employment Opportunity, as amended by E.O. 11375 – Amending Executive Order 11246 Relating to Equal Employment Opportunity, and as supplemented by regulations at 41 CFR Part 60 – Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor.

During the performance of this contract, the Service Provider agrees as follows:

(1) The Service Provider will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The Service Provider will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Service Provider agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the contracting officer setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

(2) The Service Provider will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Service Provider, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.

(3) The Service Provider will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or

another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the Service Provider's legal duty to furnish information.

(4) The Service Provider will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided by the Service Provider contracting officer, advising the labor union or workers' representative of the Service Provider's commitments under section 202 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

(5) The Service Provider will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.

(6) The Service Provider will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the contracting Service Provider and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.

(7) In the event of the Service Provider's non-compliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of such rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated or suspended in whole or in part and the Service Provider may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.

(8) The Service Provider will include the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each sub-Service Provider or Service Provider. The Service Provider will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as may be directed by the Secretary of Labor as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance:

Provided, however, that in the event the Service Provider becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a sub-Service Provider or Service Provider as a result of such direction,

the Service Provider may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

Provided, however, that in the event a Service Provider becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a sub-Service Provider or Service Provider as a result of such direction by the administering Service Provider, the Service Provider may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted construction work:

Provided, That if the applicant so participating is a State or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any Service Provider, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

The applicant agrees that it will assist and cooperate actively with the administering Service Provider and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of Service Providers and sub-Service Providers with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, that it will furnish the administering Service Provider and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist the administering Service Provider in the discharge of the Service Provider's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

The applicant further agrees that it will refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a Service Provider debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon Service Providers and sub-Service Providers by the administering Service Provider or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of the Executive Order. In addition, the applicant agrees that if it fails or refuses to comply with these undertakings, the administering Service Provider may take any or all of the following actions:

Cancel, terminate, or suspend in whole or in part this grant (contract, loan, insurance, guarantee); refrain from extending any further assistance to the applicant under the program with respect to which the failure or refund occurred until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant; and refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

Contract Provisions for Non-Federal Entity Contracts Under Federal Awards 2 CFR Appendix II to Part 200 and Other Contract Provisions

All Service Providers and Respondents submitting proposals for goods and services when Federal Funds are being expended agree to comply with the following contract provisions:

Minority Businesses, Women’s Businesses and Small Businesses 2 CFR 200.321 (a)

If the Service Provider intends to let any subcontracts for a portion of the work, Service Provider shall take affirmative steps to assure that small, minority and women’s businesses are used when possible as sources of supplies, equipment, construction and services. Affirmative steps shall consist of: (1) including qualified small, minority, and women’s businesses on solicitation lists; (2) assuring that small, minority, and women’s businesses are solicited whenever they are potential sources; (3) dividing total requirements when economically feasible, into small tasks or quantities to permit maximum participation of small, minority, and women’s businesses; (4) establishing delivery schedules, where the requirements of the work permit, which will encourage participation by small, minority and women’s businesses; (5) using the services and assistance of the Small Business Administration and the Minority Business Development Service Provider of the United States Department of Commerce; and (7) Service Provider is encouraged to procure goods and services from labor surplus area firms.

Copeland “Anti-Kickback” Act (18 U.S.C. 874 and 40 U.S.C. 276c)

All contracts and sub-grants in excess of \$2,000 for construction or repairs awarded by recipients and sub-recipients must include a provision for compliance with the Copeland “Anti-Kickback” Act (18 U.S.C. 874), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3 – Service Providers and Sub-Service Providers on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in Part by Loans or Grants from the United States). The Act provides that each Service Provider or sub-recipient shall be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he is otherwise entitled. The recipient shall report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal Awarding Service Provider.

Davis-Bacon Act as amended (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148)

When required by Federal program legislation, all prime construction contracts in excess of \$2,000 awarded by non-Federal entities must include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141-3144, and 3146-3148) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5, “Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Covering Federally Financed and Assisted Construction”). In accordance with the statute, Service Providers must be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, Service Providers must be required to pay wages not less than once a week. The non-Federal entity must place a copy of the current prevailing wage determination issued by the Department of Labor in each solicitation. The decision to award a contract or subcontract must

be conditioned upon the acceptance of the wage determination. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal Awarding Service Provider.

Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708)

Where applicable, all contracts awarded by the non-Federal entity in excess of \$100,000 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Under 40 U.S.C. 3702 of the Act, each Service Provider must be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the work week. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

Compliance with the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act

(1) Overtime requirements. No Service Provider or sub-Service Provider contracting for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.

(2) Violation; liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (1) of this section the Service Provider and any sub-Service Provider responsible therefor shall be liable for the unpaid wages

(3) Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. The District shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the Service Provider or sub-Service Provider under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime Service Provider, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime Service Provider, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such Service Provider or sub-Service Provider for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section.

(4) Subcontracts. The Service Provider or sub-Service Provider shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the sub-Service Providers to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime Service

Provider shall be responsible for compliance by any sub-Service Provider or lower tier sub-Service Provider with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (1) through (4) of this section.”

Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract or Agreement.

If the Federal award meets the definition of “funding agreement” under 37 CFR §401.2 (a) and the recipient or sub-recipient wishes to enter into a contract with a small business firm or nonprofit organization regarding the substitution of parties, assignment or performance of experimental, developmental, or research work under that “funding agreement,” the recipient or sub-recipient must comply with the requirements of 37 CFR Part 401, “Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements,” and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding Service Provider.

Clean Air Act/Clean Water Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387), as amended—Contracts and sub-grants of amounts in excess of \$150,000 must contain a provision that requires the non-Federal award to agree to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387). Violations must be reported to the Federal Awarding Service Provider and the Regional Office of the Environmental Protection Service Provider (EPA).

The Service Provider agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.

The Service Provider also agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.

Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S. C. 1352)

Service Providers who apply or RFP for an award of \$100,000 or more shall file the attached certification. (See Attachment B to this Addendum). Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Service Provider, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. The disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient.

Buy American—7 CFR 210.21 (d) and N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-20; 2 CFR 200.322 Domestic Preferences for Procurements.

The Purchasing Agent shall take all necessary steps to provide in the specifications for goods and services, and to take to the maximum effort practicable to purchase manufactured and farm products and/or “domestic commodity or products” (51% or more), of the United States be used, wherever available for the food services program. This “Buy American” clause is in

compliance with 7 CFR 210.21 (d), N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-20 and the Buy American Provisions as outlined in the USDA Memo SP 38-2017 dated June 30, 2017.

The Purchasing Agent should to the greatest extent practicable under a [Federal award](#), provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United [States](#) (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products).

(b) For purposes of this section:

(1) “Produced in the United States” means, for iron and steel products, that all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States.

(2) “Manufactured products” means items and construction materials composed in whole or in part of non-ferrous metals such as aluminum; plastics and polymer-based products such as polyvinyl chloride pipe; aggregates such as concrete; glass, including optical fiber; and lumber.

Debarment and Suspension—2 CFR Appendix II Section (H) (E.O. 12549 and E.O. 12689)

A contract award (see 2 CFR 180.220) must not be made to parties listed on the government wide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with the OMB guidelines at 2 CFR 180 that implement Executive Orders 12549 (3 CFR part 1986 Comp., p. 189) and 12689 (3 CFR part 1989 Comp., p 235). Debarment and Suspension. SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549. (Ref. 2 CFR 200.212) (See Attachment C to this Addendum)

Service Providers with awards that exceed the small purchase threshold must provide the required certification regarding its exclusion status and that of its principal employees. (Authority: 20 U.S.C. 1221e-3, 3474; OMB Circular A-110)

The Service Provider shall complete and submit a Certification of Non-Debarment for Federal Government Contracts form as provided in this document.

Procurement of Recovered Materials (Solid Waste Disposal Act; Resource Conservation and Recovery Act)

Service Provider must comply with section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The requirements of Section 6002 include procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Service Provider (EPA) at 40 CFR part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the item exceeds \$10,000 or the value of the quantity acquired during the preceding fiscal year exceeded \$10,000; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that

maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines.

Political Activities (Hatch Act, 31 USC § 1352)

None of the funds, materials, property or services provided directly or indirectly in this Contract shall be used in the performance of this Contract for any partisan political activity of any kind or to further the election or defeat of any candidate for public office. None of the funds provided under this Contract shall be used for publicity or propaganda purposes designed to support or defeat legislation pending before the U.S. Congress or any State or Local legislative bodies. Service Provider shall at all times comply with 31 U.S.C. § 1352.

Energy Efficiency Standards

The Service Provider and the Board shall comply with environmental standards and policies related to energy efficiency which are contained in the State Energy Conservation Plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (PUB.L.94-163, 89 STAT.871).

Termination of Contract

If the Board determines that the Service Provider has failed to comply with the terms and conditions of the RFP and/or Proposal upon which the issuance of the contract is based or that the Service Provider has failed to perform said service, duties and or responsibilities in a timely, proper, professional and/or efficient manner, then the Board shall have the authority to terminate the contract upon written notice setting forth the reason for termination and effective date of termination.

Termination by the Board of the contract does not absolve the Service Provider from potential liability for damages caused by the District by the Service Provider's breach of this agreement. The Board may withhold payment due the Service Provider and apply the same towards damages once established. The Board will act diligently in accordance with governing statutes to mitigate damages. Damages may include the additional cost of procuring said services or goods from other sources.

The Service Provider further agrees to indemnify and hold the District harmless from any liability to sub-Service Providers or suppliers concerning work performed or goods provided arising out of the lawful termination of this agreement.

STANDARDS (CODE) OF CONDUCT; CONFLICTS OF INTERESTS/GRATUITIES:

The LAKEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION pursuant to **Federal Regulation 2 CFR 200.318 (c) (1), N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 et seq., and N.J.S.A. 18A:12-21 et seq.**, hereby establishes the following *Standards of Conduct; Conflict of Interests* in the selection, award and administration of contracts using federal funds.

ALL PROCUREMENTS MUST ENSURE THAT THERE IS OPEN AND FREE COMPETITION AND ADHERE TO THE MOST RESTRICTIVE FEDERAL/STATE/LOCAL REQUIREMENTS.

Conflict of Interest

No employee, officer, or agent of LAKEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION may participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by a Federal award if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest. Such a conflict of interest would arise when the employee, officer, or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein, has a financial or other interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract.

No person officially connected with, or employed in, the LAKEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION shall be an agent for, or be in any way pecuniary or beneficially interested in, or receive any compensation or reward of any kind for, the sale of any textbooks, school apparatus or supplies of any kind, for use in the school district with which he is connected or by which he is employed or within the state or part thereof over which his jurisdiction extends, upon penalty of removal from office or of revocation of his certificate to teach or to administer, direct or supervise the teaching, instruction or educational guidance of pupils in the public schools, but the prohibition of this section shall not prevent any person from receiving royalties upon the sale of any textbook of which he is the author. N.J.S.A. 18A:6-8

No school official shall act in his official capacity in any matter where he, a member of his immediate family, or a business organization in which he has an interest, has a direct or indirect financial involvement that might reasonably be expected to impair his objectivity or independence of judgment. No school official shall act in his official capacity in any matter where he or a member of his immediate family has a personal involvement that is or creates some benefit to the school official or member of his immediate family. N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24 (c)

Solicitation/Receipt/Acceptance of Gratuities, Favors and Gifts from Service Providers

The officers, employees, and agents of LAKEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION may neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, gifts or anything of monetary value from Service Providers or parties to subcontracts.

School board members, school officials and employees, or members of their immediate family are prohibited from soliciting, receiving or agreeing to receive any compensation, reward, employment, gift, meal, honorarium, travel, reimbursement, favor, loan, service, or other thing of value from any person, firm, corporation, partnership, or business that is a recipient of a

purchase order from the district, or a potential bidder, or an applicant for any contract with the district, based upon an understanding that what is solicited or offered was for the purpose of influencing the board member or school employee in the discharge of their official duties.

N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24 (c); 2 CFR 200.318 (c) (1)

Service Provider/Service Provider Responsibility – Doing Business with the Board of Education

Any Service Provider doing business or proposing to do business with the LAKEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION, shall neither pay, offer to pay, either directly or indirectly, any fee, commission, or compensation, nor offer any gift, gratuity, or other thing of value of any kind to any official or employee of the Board or to any member of the official's or employee's immediate family. No Service Provider shall cause to influence or attempt to cause to influence, any official or employee of the Board, in any manner which might tend to impair the objectivity or independence of judgment of said official or employee.

Disciplinary Actions for Violations of Standards

Officers, employees and agents of LAKEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION who violate the standards of conduct, shall be subject to administrative disciplinary actions which may lead to suspension of employment; removal of office and revocation of his certificate to teach or administer in the State of New Jersey.

Disclosure of Fraudulent Activities

The Board of Education will disclose all violations of Federal criminal law involving fraud, bribery, or gratuity violations potentially affecting the Federal award pursuant to Uniform Grant Guidance, 2 CFR 200.113. Such disclosures must occur in a timely manner and be submitted in writing to the United States Department of Education or the New Jersey Department of Education.

STEVENS AMENDMENT

The LAKEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION recognizes its obligation as it pertains to the Stevens Amendment, Section 8136 of the Department of Defense Appropriations Act (P.L. 104-134, Sec.507) which requires the board of education to state clearly the
