52.212-1 Instructions to Offerors (Addendum Replacing 52.212-1 in full) **READ THOROUGHLY**

1. PROPOSAL FORMAT

1.1. This section provides guidance to the offeror for preparing a proposal in response to the solicitation. The offeror's proposal shall include all data and information required by this solicitation and submitted in accordance with these instructions. Any contract resulting from this effort shall be required to meet United States Government regulations and statutory requirements. In addition, the offeror is expected to ensure compliance with all laws, regulations, standards, and any other constraints specifically identified in the solicitation.

1.2. The proposal submitted in response to the solicitation is recommended to be formatted as stated below and furnished as stated herein. All volumes shall not be protected by passwords.

1.3. Offerors shall scan all files for computer viruses prior to submission to the Government.

1.4. Proposals may not include classified information.

2. PROPOSAL CONTENT

2.1 Contractor is recommended to submit the following.

a. **Pricing** for all CLINS to mirror the unit of issue and quantity on the CLIN schedule.

b. **Technical** proposal addressing the following:

Service Availability: The contractor must provide continuous local voice service with a minimum of 99.9% availability on a 24/7/365 basis (PWS Paragraph 2.0).

• **Scheduled Outage Notifications:** For any planned maintenance, the contractor must notify the government at least 30 days in advance, maintaining a 100% notification rate (PWS Paragraph 2.1.1).

• **Catastrophic Outages:** The contractor must respond within one hour of notification to begin mitigation (PWS Paragraph 2.1.4.1).

• **Emergency Outages:** The contractor must respond within one hour and completely restore service within eight hours (PWS Paragraph 2.1.4.2).

• **Serious Outages:** The contractor must respond within one hour and completely restore service within 24 hours (PWS Paragraph 2.1.4.3).

• **Routine Outages:** The contractor must respond within one hour and completely restore service within two calendar days (PWS Paragraph 2.1.4.4).

• **Quality of Service (QoS):** All voice and real-time data traffic must meet ITU (International Telecommunication Union) latency and jitter standards to guarantee operational call quality.

The addition of contractor terms and conditions is highly discouraged.

2.3 **Joint Ventures:** Contractor must submit the following if applicable:

1) A small business joint venture offeror must submit, with its offer, the representation required in paragraph (c) of FAR solicitation provision 52.212-3, Offeror Representations and Certifications-Commercial Products and Commercial Services, and paragraph (c) of FAR solicitation provision 52.219-1, Small Business Program Representations, in accordance with 52.204-8(d) and 52.212-3(b) for the following categories:



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- (A) Small business;
- (B) Service-disabled veteran-owned small business;
- (C) Women-owned small business (WOSB) under the WOSB Program;
- (D) Economically disadvantaged women-owned small business under the WOSB Program; or
- (E) Historically underutilized business zone small business.

52.212-2 Evaluation—Commercial Items (Addendum Replacing 52.212-2 in full)

BASIS OF AWARD: The Gov't will award a firm-fixed priced contract to the responsible offeror representing the best value to the gov't, using a streamlined comparative trade-off evaluation in accordance with FAR 12.203 and the below, which may result in award to other than lowest priced quote.

Your quote should contain your best terms. The Gov't reserves the right to reject without further review quotes which contain additional terms and conditions or exclusions requiring extensive legal or higher level reviews.

After the evaluation of quotes, the Contracting Officer may negotiate final terms with one or more quoters of the Government's choice. The Contracting Officer will not negotiate with any quoters other than those of the Government's choice and will not use the formal source selection procedures described in FAR Part 15.

LATE SUBMISSIONS: The Gov't will not consider any quote that we receive after the deadline unless we receive it before we award a contract and consideration of the quote is otherwise in the best interest of the Gov't.

STANDING PRICE QUOTATIONS: Standing price quotations may be used if needed and deemed in the best interest of the Gov't.

PRICE: Gov't will record total evaluated prices (to include options). If more than 3 quotes are received, the Gov't will identify a grouping of the most competitively priced quotes; remaining quotes will not be evaluated further unless later deemed necessary by the Contracting Officer.

Options. The Government will evaluate offer for award purposes by adding the total price for all options to the total price for the basic requirement. The Government may determine that an offer is unacceptable if the option prices are significantly unbalanced. Evaluation of options shall not obligate the Government to exercise the option(s).

Additionally, as part of price evaluation, the Government will evaluate its option to extend services (see FAR Clause 52.217-8) by calculating the price for six months of performance using the monthly pricing from the offeror's final option period prices. The calculated six month price will be added to the offeror's total proposed price. Thus, the offeror's total price for the purpose of evaluation will include the base period, all option periods, and the calculated six month extension price. This evaluation will not obligate the Government to exercise any option under FAR 52.217-8.

TECHNICAL: The Government will evaluate the technical proposal to determine how well the proposed products or services meet the Government's requirement. The Gov't may deem a quote to be technically acceptable or superior if their technical solution differs from the PWS or does not meet the technical minimums, but ultimately results in a solution that will meet or exceed the intent of the Government's needs and would involve an acceptable level of risk.

MULTIPLE AWARDS: Gov't will not make multiple awards unless circumstances deem it appropriate and in the best interest of the Gov't.



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AWARDING WITHIN BUDGET: If deemed necessary to stay within budget, the Gov't may reduce quantities and reach out to offerors with acceptable or better non-price proposals, requesting they revalidate or update their unit pricing. Alternatively, the Gov't may cancel the requirement if needed.

Antiterrorism/Operations Security/Information Protection Requirements

1. Access and General Protection/Security Policy and Procedures. This standard language is for contractor employees with an area of performance within Government controlled installation, facility, or area. The contractor shall comply with all applicable installation/facility access and local security policies and procedures, which may be obtained from the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). The contractor shall also provide all information required for background checks to meet installation access requirements to be accomplished by the local installation's Security Forces, Director of Emergency Services or local Security Office. The contractor shall ensure compliance with all personal identity verification requirements as directed by DoD, HAF and/or local policy. Should the Force Protection Condition (FPCON) change, the Government may require changes in contractor security matters or processes.

2. For Contractors that do not require CAC, but require access to a DoD Facility and/or Installation. Contractor and all associated sub-contractors employees shall comply with adjudication standards and procedures using the National Crime Information Center Interstate Identification Index (NCIC-III) and Terrorist Screening Database (TSDB) (AFI 10-245, AFI 31-101 and AFMAN 31-113), applicable installation, facility and area commander installation/facility access and local security policies and procedures (provided by government representative), or, at OCONUS locations, in accordance with status of forces agreements and other theater regulations.

3. Requirement for OPSEC Training. In accordance with AFI 10-701, Operations Security, OPSEC PMs/SMO/SMNCOs/Coordinators will provide OPSEC training or training materials to contract employees within 30 days of employees' initial assignment to the contract and prior to having access to any critical information (CI) and annually thereafter. General organizational orientations may need to be supplemented by duty-related orientations in the work center targeted toward specific critical information and vulnerabilities associated with the work.
